COMMUNICATIONS:

<u>COUNCILMEMBER BAKER</u> expressed his gratitude to the volunteers, employees, businesses and residents for their participation in the Winterfest. It is important to still be careful in this winter weather. Steven Covey shared with us, "the key is not to prioritize whates on your schedule, but to schedule your priorities." He stated that he offers this quote up because we are in scheduling our priorities as a city, and

entering the budget process for the next fiscal year. It is important for us to look at where we are headed and listen to opinions on where we are to go as a city. As we continue to work our way through the process, we cannot overstate the value of an increasing technology role. He is excited for the opportunities that are in front of us and looking forward to it. As a MML quick reminder, the Governor will be releasing his proposed budget on Wednesday, and it is important for us to pay attention and advocate for what is best for Berkley.

MAYOR PRO TEM TERBRACK acknowledged the extreme success of the Winterfest this past weekend, and he thanked staff and volunteers for their efforts. It truly is a great community event, with activities for all ages. The event certainly was a resounding success and he thanked everyone for their involvement.

COUNCILMEMBER EDGAR had no comments this evening.

<u>COUNCILMEMBER KIDECKEL</u> concurred with all of Mayor Pro Tem Terbracks comments. He congratulated Cinda Coon for winning the chili/soup cook off. He noted that Firehouse Subs has opened and he encouraged the community to patronize of this business. He welcomed the new Recreation Board members and thanked Mr. Gaudet and Dale Goodcourage for their service to the board.

CITY MANAGER BAIS-DISESSA encourage the audience to visit the Citys website for a calendar of City events. She congratulated the Parks Department for all their great work and recognized the Public Safety Department. She noted that Mavoto Real Estate Research Group did a review of the three counties and out of the 102 cities with a population of over 10,000; the City of Berkley was one of the top 5 safest cities. She noted that an IT professional has been recently hired and he will be working on the mobile app. We are always striving to be faster, better, and more efficient. Public Works has been getting praised for their work on clearing the snow and we are doing our best to remove the snow from the roads. Please be patient in this very high volume of snow winter.

FINANCE DIRECTOR SABUDA had no comments this evening.

COUNCILMEMBER STEADMAN: stated that this past year, The Friends of the Library have given the library approximately \$11,000. This Saturday is the annual Friends Valentines Bake Sale from 10-2. Please visit the library's website for information on the many programs offered. Next Tuesday, Feb 11th, Dr. Roy E. Finkenbine of the University of Detroit Mercy will give a fascinating talk on Solomon Northrup, whose story inspired the book, *12 Years a Slave*.

<u>CITY ATTORNEY STARAN</u> returned to a recurring topic, the status of medical marijuana law. He gave a brief update and stated the Free Press reported on a couple of bills that are working their way through the State of Michigan. He noted that while it looked as if there was originally a lot of momentum behind the bills - which authorized additional types of products, and would allow dispensaries subject to local regulation - the bills are now in committee, and appears to be stalled at this time. It is hard to tell what may happen since the law continues to evolve.
