## November Happenings



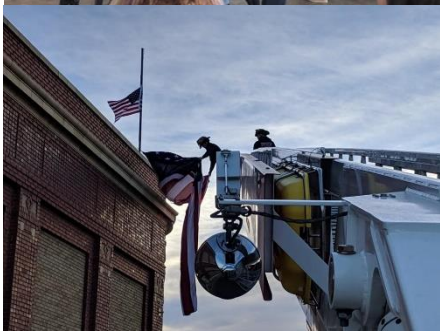

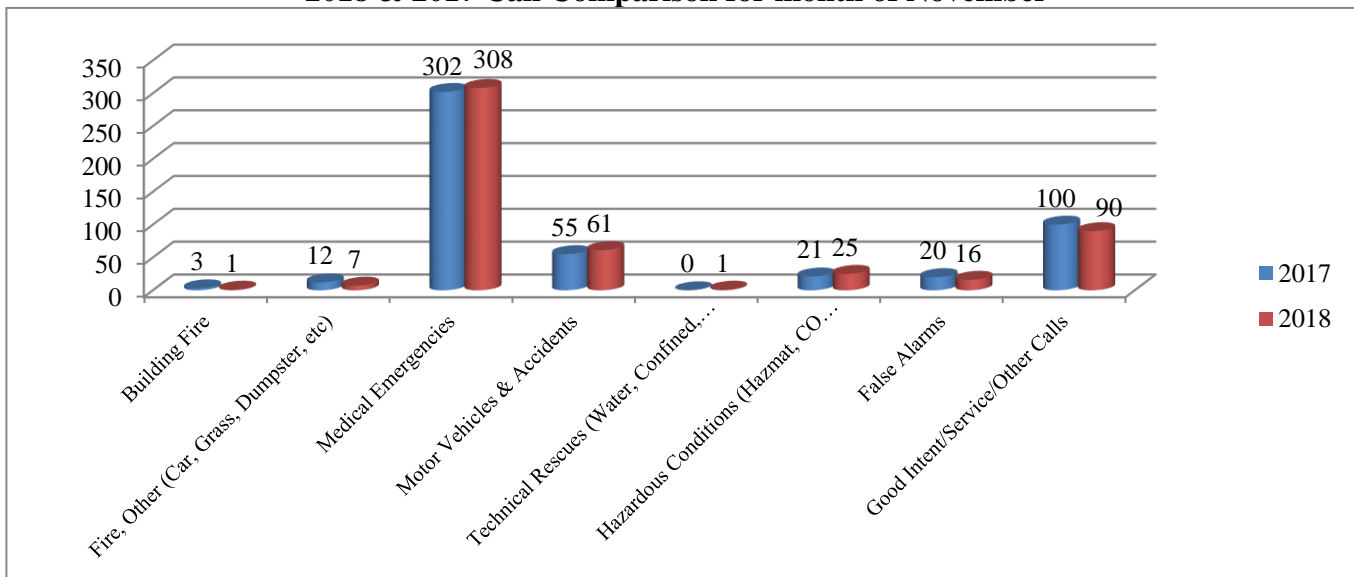

### Calls and Events of Significant Importance:

- November 04, West of Silver Peaks Sub., Companies responded to an oil site fire. The flare off apparatus was malfunctioning was on fire creating an exposure hazard for the surrounding separators and tank battery. Crews stood by until responsible parties arrived and shut in the wells. Crews then extinguished the fire with no issues and turned the site back over to the operators.
- On November 7<sup>th</sup> crews were dispatched to a 13y/o with CPR in progress. ADCOM advised that the staff was doing CPR. Amb 52 on the scene and began care and E51 assisted. The 13y/o was transported with pulses to Children's Hospital and was expected to have a full recovery.

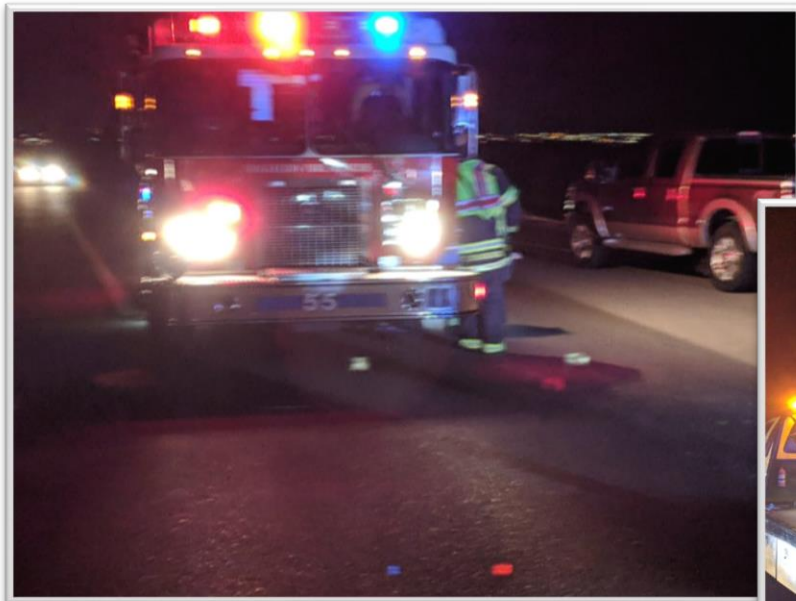

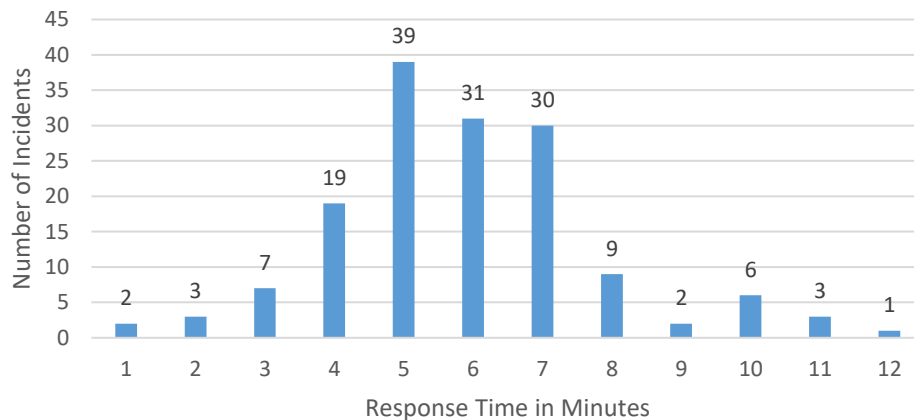

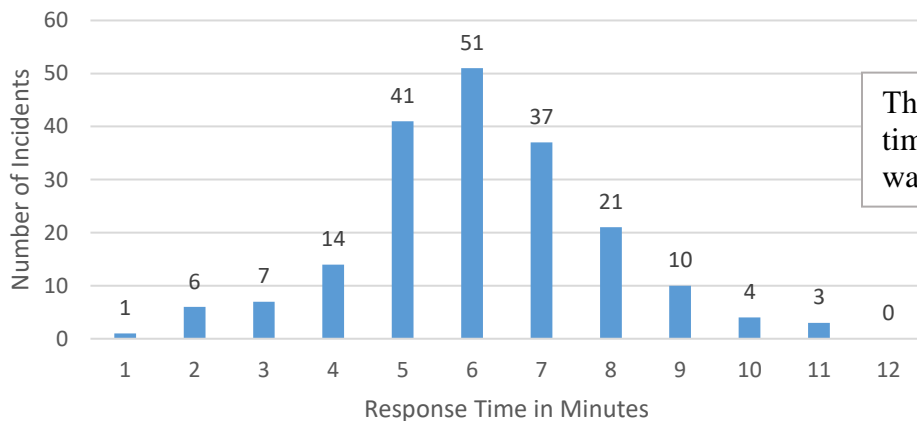


This month the District's response time in the Station 51 coverage area was 8 minutes or less 92% of the time.

Station 52 Response Area

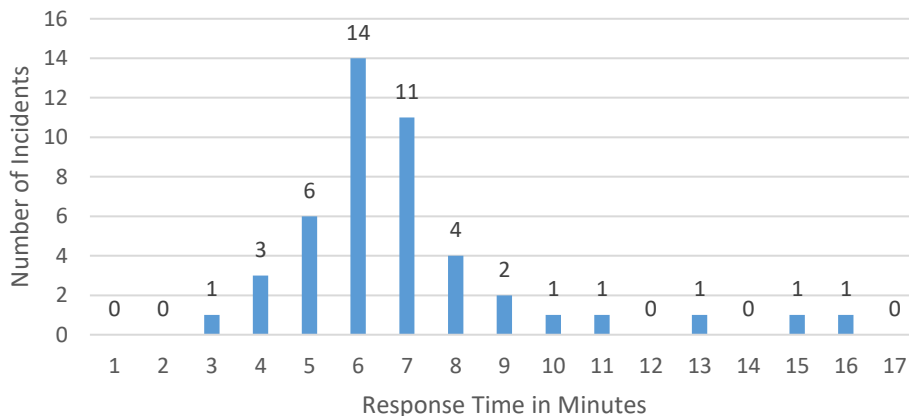


This month the District's response time in the Station 52 coverage area was 9 minutes or less 94% of the time.

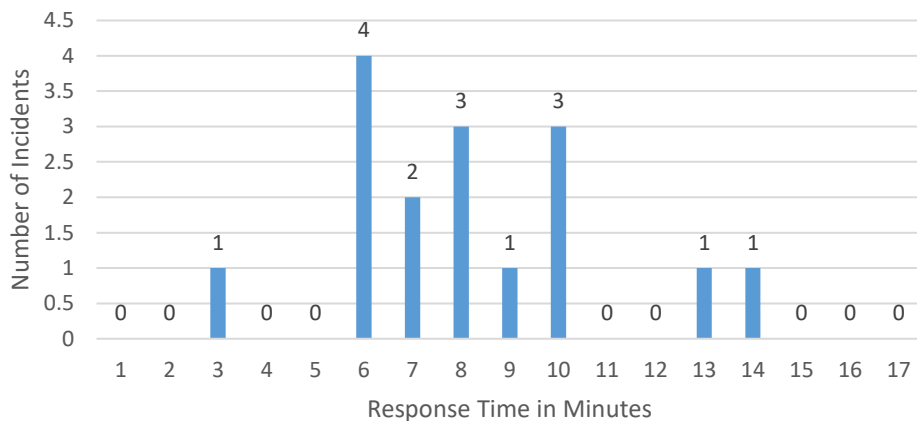


This month the District's response time in the Station 53 coverage area was 10 minutes or less 91% of the time.

Station 53 Response Area



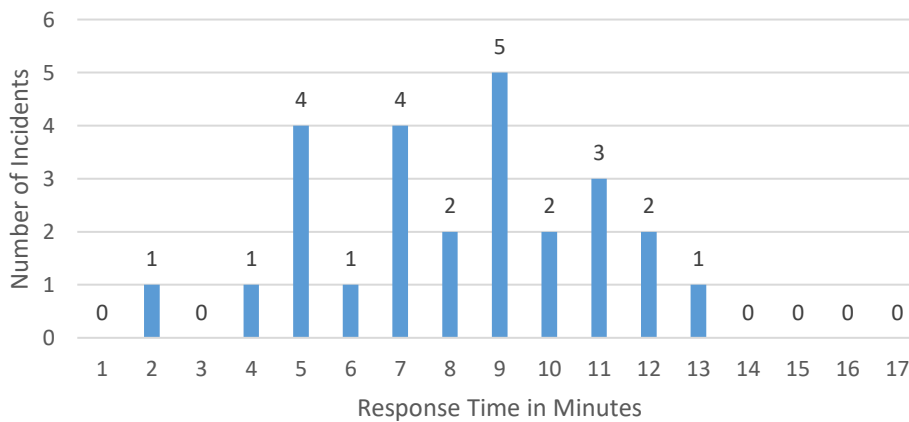
Response Time by Number of Incidents

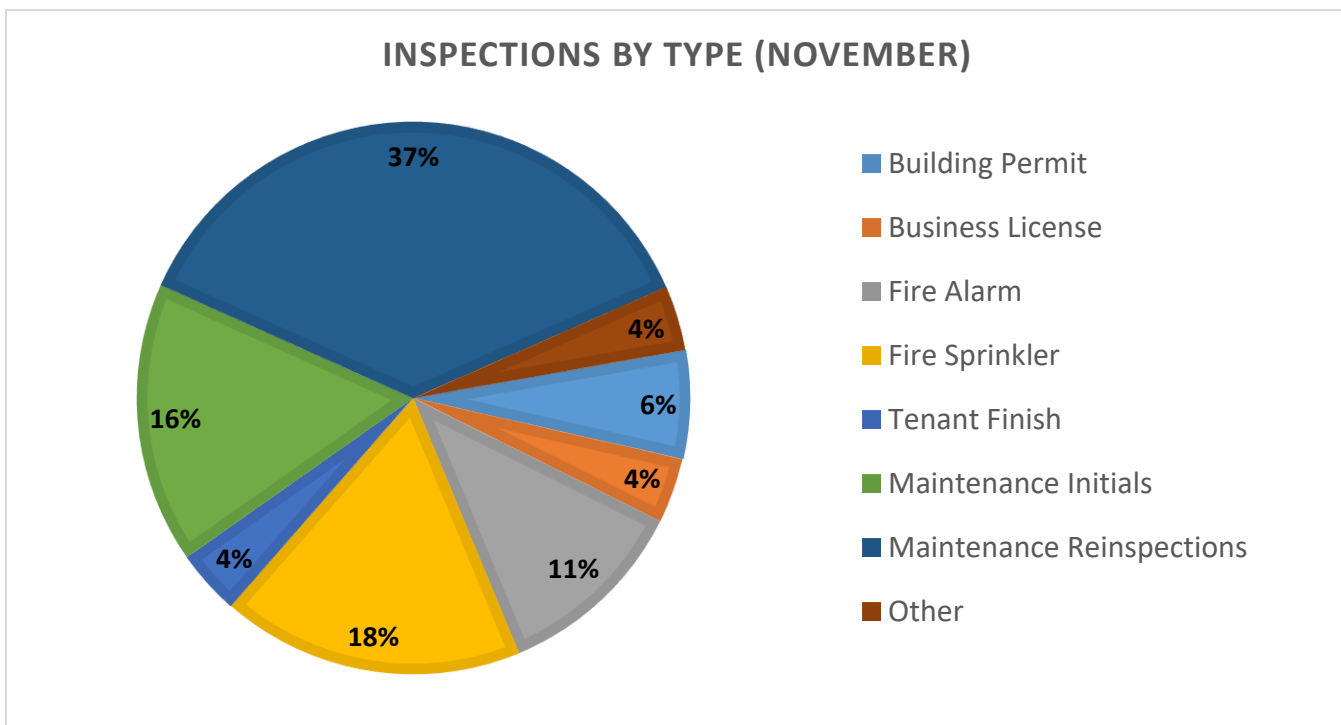
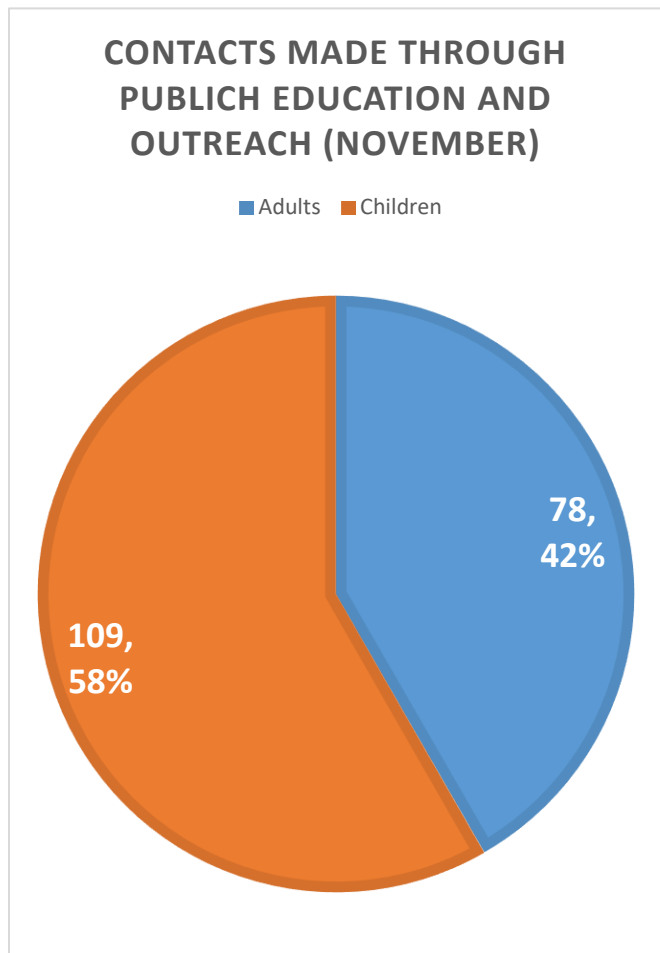
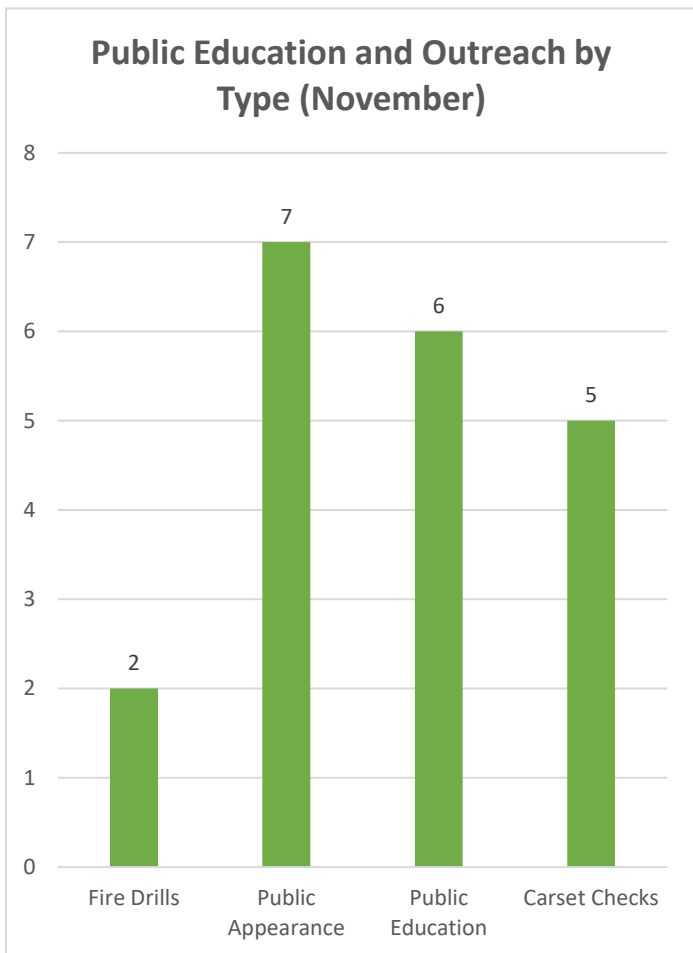
- Res Engine 51

### Report from Facility Maintenance Coordinator:

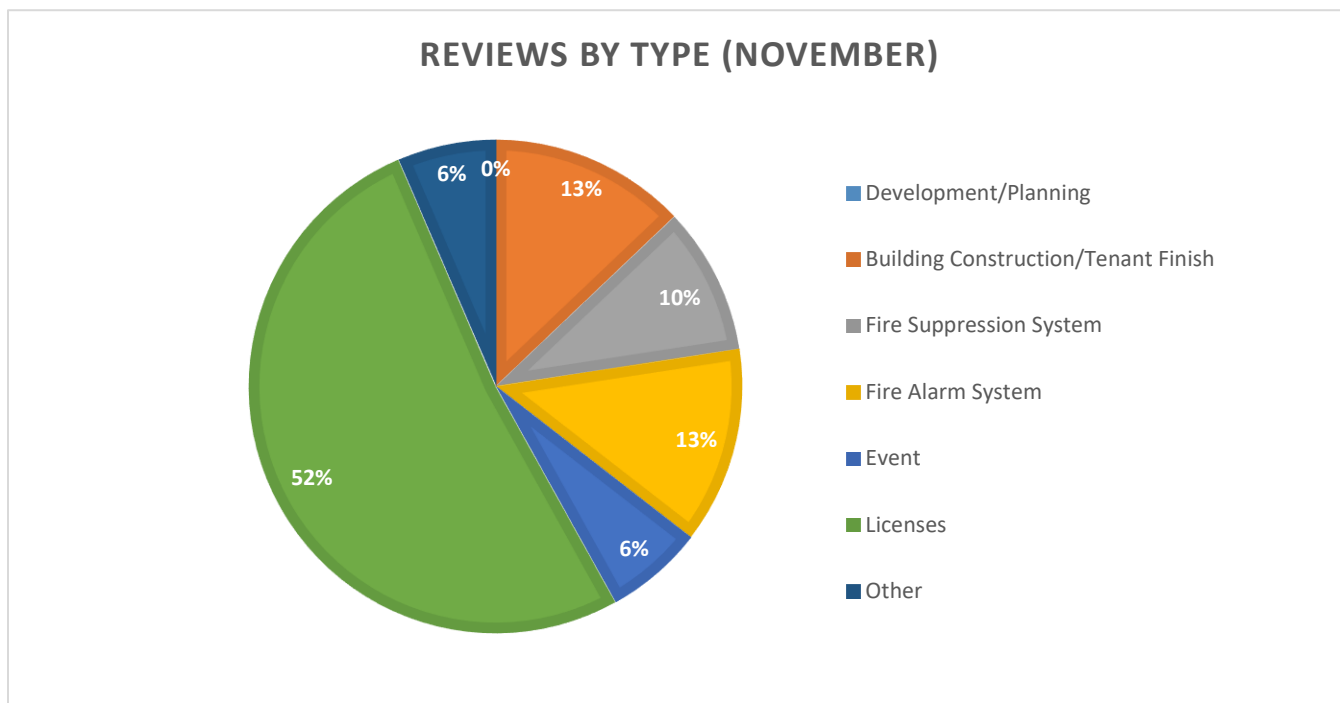
- All station irrigation systems have been winterized

#### New Development Update:

- Brighton 27J Elementary School 13 to be located in Brighton Crossing has submitted for review of their final development plan.
- A proposed Firestone Complete Auto Care to be located on the northeast corner of 50<sup>th</sup> and Bridge came in for a pre-application meeting.
- Western United Electric plans to build a 5,000 square foot addition on to their building.
- Planet Fitness passed all final inspections.
- The first building of the 76 Commerce Center project has passed all final inspections and plans for the next building have been submitted for review.
- Sable Mini Storage will be expanding to the lot to the north.
- Abra Autobody located next to Kum & GO on East 152<sup>nd</sup> and I76 has begun construction.
- Plans for the leased single-family home development on the lot to the west of Elements has submitted plans for their clubhouse for review.

#### Fire Investigation Summary:

- November 4, 2018 – Homestead Well Pad Fire – The fire was confined to an enclosed combustor and was most likely caused by a malfunction allowing liquid fuel to reach the ignitor.

## Office of Emergency Management Report

### **Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG)**

2019 application with signatures complete, meeting with Regional Field manager 1/7/19 to review application prior for submittal

Will be focusing 2019 on the following plans/objectives:

- Assess capabilities and develop Rapid Needs Assessment Plan (RNA)
- Update Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) for 2019 adoption
- Continue to refine Resource Mobilization Plan with continued training/drills
- Conduct at least 2 Exercises- participate in regional training/drills/exercises
- Conduct at least 2 stakeholder meeting (Brighton BEST meeting)

**BEST Meeting:** completed. December 12, 1400-1600 Brighton EOC (PD Training room) OEM working on meeting minutes and gathering resources to provide to members

**EOC/ Emergency Drill:** conducted December 18, 1200-1400. Conducted a short EOP training followed by a discussion based exercise on preparing and responding to a winter storm event. Currently working on assessing the reviews and developing an AAR.

**2019 EOP Updates-** Currently utilizing DHSEM tools to identify priority update areas and potential gaps in content to address in updates. Expected completion in Q3 2019

**OEM Annual Report to Council-** to be conducted at Feb 12<sup>th</sup> Study Session

**Emergency Preparedness for Seniors-** CERT provided basic preparedness training to 20 seniors at Eagleview Adult Center, December 10th

**Emergency Preparedness for People with Disabilities Workshop-** Brighton cohosted community training with Adams County SO/OEM, Rocky Mtn. MRC and UC Assistive Technology for *People with Disabilities Their Families Friends and Caregivers* in Brighton. Additional classes completed in Boulder, Aurora and Auraria campus. Funding for two additional classes exists and will target spring/Summer of 2019 for full completion.

**Eagleview Adult Center Generator Wiring Project-** no vendor bid on first open RFP. Denver invited 4 vendors to bid and two are currently working with facilities to schedule site visits. Funding has been deferred to 2019.

**2018 NATIONAL GEOSPATIAL PREPAREDNESS SUMMIT-** OEM and OEM volunteer on behalf of the city and participated in functional EOC exercise addressing current and future applications of GIS applications to preparedness and response operations

**2019 Colorado Emergency Management Conference-** Scheduled to take place in Loveland, CO Feb. 19-22<sup>nd</sup>. OEM, PD Commander and OEM volunteer to attend
