**STOP and VERIFY - This message came from outside of the City of College Place.**

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Mike,

PocketiNet is supportive of the grant application the City of College Place is submitting to provide community internet hot spots. PocketiNet will partner with the City by extending our fiber to the vicinity of each park at no cost to the City. The construction costs below to bring fiber to each park and install the hotspots reflect a discount of our normal costs for this work as well.

The following are the costs associated with installing Wi-Fi Hot Spots at each of the specified locations. The cost is for labor, materials, and electronic equipment to make the hot spots work and provide internet service to the park areas and parking lots as discussed in our meeting. If there is a need for an electrician to provide an electrical outlet at the park poles, this cost would be extra.

Lions Park: \$7,500 plus tax. Extend fiber service across Larch and into the Community Building. Install Wi-Fi access point inside the building, install outside access point on a mast on the outside of the building, connect existing cameras to the new fiber service.

Kiwanis Park: \$6,650 plus tax. Extend fiber across Date Street to Park camera pole. Install Wi-Fi access point on existing camera pole, connect existing cameras to new fiber service.

Veterans Park: \$2,700 plus tax. Extend fiber to Park camera pole. Install Wi-Fi access point on existing camera pole, connect cameras to new fiber service.

City Hall: \$1,500 plus tax. Install an access point on a mast on the roof of the Police Building. Connect the access point to the existing internet service in the building.

Total for all 4 locations is \$18,350 plus tax.

The cost to provide internet service at each of the three park hot spots is \$90/month, or \$270 per month total. If you receive the grant, Pocketinet will work with the City to reduce this monthly payment as a community service.
