
## **About the Trail**

The three (3) mile Buck Creek Trail is designed as multi-purpose nature trail. The paved trail will be accessible for bicycles, walkers, runners, and other non-motorized users. The trail will follow Buck Creek and meander through the floodway and scenic natural areas.



Trail nodes and furnishings are designed to reflect the natural surroundings of the trail. Connecter trails are included in the design to connect six (6) neighborhoods to the trail. Loops have also been included in the area near Lions Park. The trail will connect to the Cumberland Pennsy Trail south of East Washington Street providing additional connections and distance.

# Getting to Buck Creek Trail

The **Historic National Road (US 40)** runs through the center of Town. Visitors from can take US HWY 40/E. Washington into town.

**I-70** runs north of Cumberland and visitors may exit at Post Road or Mt. Comfort Road and head south to US 40.

From I-465 exit onto East Washington Street and follow Washington Street (US 40) into Cumberland.




#### **About Buck Creek**

Buck Creek is one of Cumberland's natural jewels. Named after all the bucks that used to be found along its banks, this tributary to Sugar Creek spans six (6) square miles within Buck Creek and Vernon Townships in Hancock County. Buck Creek flows southwest into Marion County and eventually joins back up with Sugar Creek. Cumberland's Buck Creek Trail will follow the floodplain and connect with the Cumberland Pennsy Trail providing overlooks to the creek and its wetlands as well as wonderful wooded areas where users just might see some of those bucks the creek was named for.
