Problem Statement: Suicide is a public health concern that can affect individuals of all ages. Many people in our community have been impacted by a suicide death. Suicide is the 8th leading cause of death of Oregon adults (OHA, 2020). Suicide is the 1st leading cause of death of Oregon youth ages 10-24 (OHA, 2020).

Goal: Increase Tillamook County resident's awareness that suicide is preventable, increase community awareness of suicide prevention crisis hotlines, and increase the number of community members who attend an evidence based suicide prevention training.
