*Option 2 – Do not include Riparian subscription with PLPOA membership dues, reduce dues to \$30/yr.



<u>Safe navigation on the water is everyone's responsibility,</u> we can all feel safer if everyone is following the rules.

*RULE 1 - It is the law on inland lakes that you operate your power boat or PWC in a <u>counter clockwise</u> direction around the perimeter of an inland lake.

With tubing boaters, ski boats, pontoon boats, and PWCs following this one simple rule, and by spacing themselves from one another as they travel counter clockwise around the perimeter of the lake, the anxiety of all boaters will be greatly reduced.

Rules of the Road - Legal, courteous, and safe boating



<u>Rule 2</u> - Michigan Law designates these operating practices as illegal:

*Reckless operation of a vessel or reckless manipulation of water skis, surfboard, or similar devise in a manner which disregards the safety or rights of others or endangers the person or property of others.

Examples:

*Weaving your vessel through congested waterway traffic

- *Jumping the wake of another vessel
- *Chasing, harassing, or disturbing wildlife

*Causing damage from the wake of your vessel such as shoreline erosion from high waves

*Failure to regulate speed

*Improper distance while towing a person(s)

*Failure to maintain the 100 ft rule from docks, rafts, fishing boats, and shore line except when traveling at a no wake speed.

<u>Rule 3 - Michigan Law prohibits anyone from boating</u> when under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

*It is also unlawful for the owner of a vessel to allow anyone else to operate their vessel if that person is under the influence of alcohol or drugs and has a blood alcohol content that is greater than 0.1% or greater by weight as determined by a breath, blood, or urine test.

•People arrested for boating under the influence are guilty of a misdemeanor . 3 convictions in 10 years the charge is raised to a felony.

•If great bodily harm or death is caused by a person operating a boat under the influence of alcohol or drugs that person will be charged with a felony.

RULES WHICH APPLY to OPERATORS OF SKI TOWING VESSELS

*In addition other stated rules-ie counterclockwise direction, every person being towed behind a vessel on water skis, a surfboard, or similar devise must wear a US Coast Guard-approved Type I, II, or III PFD. Inflatable PFDs may not be used.

*Every vessel towing a person on water skis, a surfboard, or similar device(tubers) must have a person on board, in addition to the operator of the vessel, observing the towed persons at all times

*It is illegal to tow persons on water skis, surfboards, or any device of this type, between: one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise if towed behind a boat. Sunset and 8am if towed behind a PWC

RULES WHICH APPLY to OPERATORS OF SKI TOWING VESSELS

- Persons being towed must stay 100 ft from:
- *A shore line (if operating in less that 3 ft of water)
- * Any moored or anchored vessel
- * A dock or raft
- * A marked swimming area

THERE ARE ALSO AGE REQUIREMENTS AND A BOATING PWC CLASS REQUIRED BEFORE YOUNGSTERS CAN OPERATE A BOAT OR PWC.

Pleasant Lake-Management History

*High level of resident support for lake conservation-

*PLPOA dates back to 1960's

*Secchi Disc and PH measuring ,1970s-2013

*Water Quality and Weed Mapping study, 1986

*Residents asked PLPOA to investigate the increasing weeds, 2012

2013-14 PLPOA Lake Management Activities

- *PLPOA lake management committee selected Aquest Inc. after detailed review of 6 vendors, secured \$5400 funding
- * Aquest Inc. lake evaluation management report completed 2013 -data on PLPOA website
- * Aquatic Plant Identification, Mapping Training July 1213,10 residents trained by Dr. Joann Latimore, MSU Professor
- *Fall 2013-PLPOA letter and petition mailed to 120 residents
- *Positive call for action, 83% of residents responding voiced support to take action to preserve Pleasant Lake ASAP

Long-term Pleasant Lake Management Plan

- PLPOA recommendation for a Special Assessment District (SAD) for lake management approved by Freedom Township, Nov 2013
- Following Jan/Feb 2014 Public hearings-Special Assessment District established for 5 years 2014-19
- Washtenaw Co. Environmental Program Office will manage effort
- Aquest Inc. will perform annual evaluations and guide Aquatic Services, Inc. for ongoing treatments
- PLPOA will continue volunteer measuring and lake management efforts with the goal of preserving water quality , fish and wildlife safety, and property values
