## Cultural Arts Commission Mission Statement

The City's Cultural Arts Commission (CAC) seeks to create an environment in which cultural arts will flourish and enhance the quality of life for all residents of Highland Park.

The CAC administers a public art program which is primarily funded through annual City allocations. The public art program has also had the good fortune of receiving artworks through gifts to the City of Highland Park.

## Public Art Advisory Group

The City Council has established a policy that Highland Park will maintain an active and ongoing public art program. To implement this policy, the Public Art Advisory Group (PAAG) was created to advise the CAC on projects to expand the breadth and quality of the public art collection in Highland Park.

The PAAG has the following duties:

- Establish guidelines for public art projects;
- Develop requests for proposals, review submitted proposals, and make recommendations to the CAC;
- Initiate location and funding recommendations for public art projects; and,
- Maintain artworks in the public art collection in conjunction with City staff.

## Park District of Highland Park Collection

An escape can be found in the 650 acres of parkland maintained by the Park District of Highland Park. The Park District has added to the natural beauty of several of its parks by installing public art at the West Ridge Center, Heller Nature Center, and Moraine Park. These parks provide a scenic, natural backdrop that enhances the beauty of these works. Over the years, artists and residents have donated sculptures to be placed throughout the City, in an effort to build a greater appreciation and understanding for the arts. The Park District encourages everyone to celebrate the arts and visit these magnificent pieces of creative expression.

## Highland Park Library Collection

Paintings, sculptures and murals grace the walls, rooms and grounds of the Highland Park Public Library, creating a varied and extensive public art collection. The art further enriches the building, and adds to the warm and inviting atmosphere for which the Library is known. Many of the pieces in the collection have a local connection, as they were created by Highland Park artists or feature nearby locales. It is primarily through the generous donations of local residents that the Library has been able to build its art collection. Prominent works in the collection include three pieces by sculptor Sylvia Shaw Judson, whose work can be found in many important collections. One particular community favorite is Harbor Seal, which is reinstalled in the Library's fountain each spring.

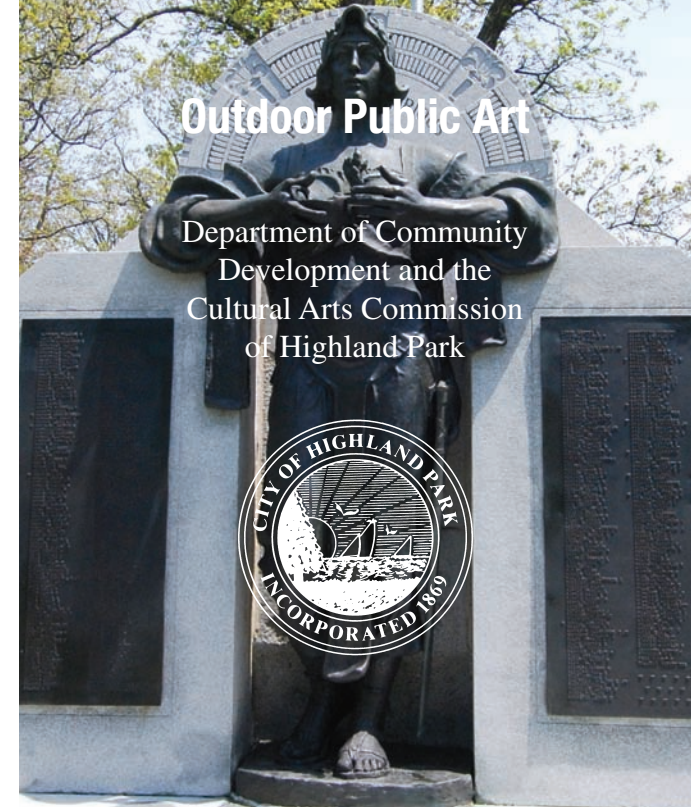
## Contribute to the Highland Park Public Art Fund

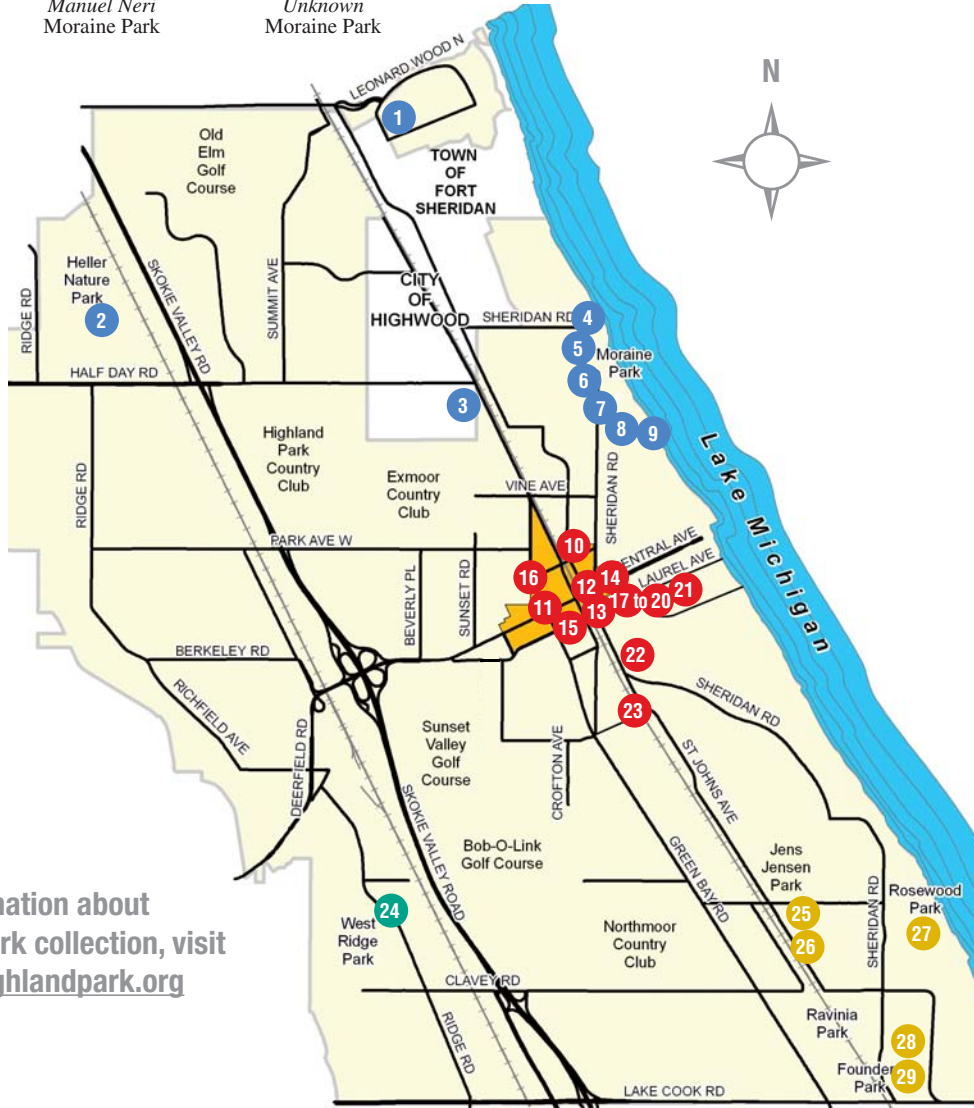
