Huntley High School Awarded Top AP Honors Third Consecutive Year

District 158 (Huntley High School) is among the best in the nation for Advanced Placement college level courses for the third straight year according to an announcement this week. The District was one of only 547 in all of the U.S. and Canada named to the fifth Annual AP District Honor Roll.

"This list shows not only that we are providing more access to AP classes, but also that our students are scoring considerably higher than many of our peers," said Superintendent John Burkey. Last year, Huntley High School had 637 AP students, up 21 percent from the year before. Those students took 1,081 AP tests, a 14 percent increase and on 74 percent of the tests students scored 3 or higher, lots better than the state average of 66 percent.

District 158 is the only district in McHenry County to receive the AP District honor for all of the past three years.
