

There have been several complaints about the railroad crossings. If you come to the railroad crossing and the arms are down and the lights are flashing and it has been a few minutes and you still don't see a train, you can do one of two things or both. One is to call the 800 number on the railroad crossing and report the situation to the railroad, or the other thing you can do is dial 911 and it will connect you with the Lampasas County Sheriff's Department and you can report the situation to them. If available they will dispatch either the Lometa Police Department or a deputy to the location who can do traffic control. If there is railroad personnel working on the lights they can give you permission to cross the tracks. Unfortunately, I have not been able to find anything in the law that allows you to use common sense and drive around it if a train is not coming. Most of the time we have an officer on duty who can come out immediately and let you cross. I will also be contacting the railroad police officer for this area to see if there is some solution to ensure that while they are working on the crossings that they have another person there to direct traffic.
