Administrative Services Committee April 16, 2018 Minutes Ed Brady called the meeting to order at 5:00pm Committee Members Present: Ed Brady, Kim Chamberland, Lisa Evans Staff: Pat Wirthlin, Finance Director; Jackie Bain, Administrative Assistant Contract with Invoice Cloud Ms. Wirthlin presented the contract and fees for services by Invoice Cloud to process customer billings and payments via web, mobile device, and text messaging. This contract will replace an existing contract with a different vendor and should provide net cost savings to the City. After the committee reviewed the information Mr. Brady asked if this will include improvements for residents to make payments with this new software. Ms. Wirthlin said that the software is very user friendly and will now allow residents to make payments using a mobile device and text messaging, in addition to the web. Contract:3-Year contract \$12,600 The Committee agreed to draft an ordinance authorizing a 3-year contract with Invoice Cloud in the amount of \$12,600. Ms. Evans seconded the motion. All voted yes 2018 Budget Amendments Ms. Wirthlin presented the information which is an extra measure as required by statute to set the budget appropriations. Staff is seeking Council approval for an Ordinance authorizing 2018 Budget Amendments netting a budget decrease of \$700,000. Council previously approved most all expenditures by way of Ordinance. This is the extra measure as required by statute to set the budget appropriations for those items. Budget Increase (Decrease)2018 New Appropriations (\$506.659)2017 Re-Appropriated (\$765,325)2018 Revenue Changes \$576,466 Total (\$695,518). The committee discussed and reviewed the information (available upon request). The Committee agreed to draft an ordinance authorizing 2018 budget amendments netting a budget decrease of \$700,000. Ms Evans seconded the motion. All voted yes. Replacement Pages to the Codified Ordinances Ms. Bain stated that once a year the City is required to pass an ordinance adopting the replacement pages to the Codified Ordinances approved during the prior twelve months and amendments to the Traffic and General Offense Codes that were adopted by the Ohio General Assembly The Committee agreed to make a motion to draft an Ordinance approving the editing and inclusion of certain ordinances as parts of the various component codes of the Codified Ordinances of Milford, Ohio Ms. Evans seconded the motion. All voted yes There being no other new business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:30pm
