



In the top 25% busiest of fire stations serving Hamilton County (58)







- \$ 3,538,870 Budget
  - 74% Salaries & Benefits
  - 14% Operations
  - 12% Capital



### Salaries & Benefits

- \$ 2,609,950
  - 7% wage increase
  - 20% health insurance cost increase incurred

# Capital Improvements

- \$412,220
  - \$50,000-architect for fire station addition
  - \$ 250,000-SCBA replacement (68% grant funded)
  - \$ 25,000-email server





- Order replacement for (or remount of) 2015 ambulance
- Complete planning and execute contract for fire station addition
- Complete 1st year of smoke/CO detector distribution program (FEMA grant)
