Public Services Committee Meeting Minutes

May 15, 2019

Pledge of Allegiance

Approval of Proceedings: The committee unanimously approved the proceedings from the April 10 2019 Public Services Committee meeting.

Norton Advertising Proposal

Mr. Kevin Norton/Norton Outdoor Advertising presented the committee and staff with updated information regarding the advertising terms and conditions on the lease agreement. Mr. Doss discussed the advertising Terms and Conditions. Mr. Norton gave a rough timeline of approximately 6 months for the project.

The Committee agreed to make a motion authorizing the Law Director to draft an ordinance authorizing the City Manager to enter into a lease agreement with Norton Advertising for a Billboard Space and Advertising. Seconded by Mr. Albrecht All yes

Leaf Policy

Mr. Clayton discussed an updated leaf policy. It is currently not efficient and is sometimes causing blocked storm sewers and contributes to flooding. To make sure residents are aware of the updated policy this information will be posted via the City website and City Newsletter.

Gravel Policy

Mr. Clayton brought to the committees attention that currently there are spots where residents are trying to place gravel so as to have a parking location that are not seven feet wide. Also mentioned was parking on the sidewalk or road at times which are not designated parking locations. The standard policy is that there is to be 7 feet between the road and the sidewalk for gravel parking locations. This information will be posted to our City website/Newsletter to make sure residents are aware of the gravel policy.

Additional matters that may properly come before the committee

Ms. Brewer informed the committee that By Golly's/Tom Seaman has purchased two golf carts to start a transportation service/GUBER service to residents within the cities South/East, Mohawk Trail and Clertoma Drive areas. Assistant Chief Mahan discussed the Ordinances and recommendations for golf carts in the city. Mayor Albrecht mentioned that he noticed signs in Terrace Park noting Golf Carts in the area. Also observed other signs elsewhere that noted a "shuttle stop, similar to a bus stop sign. This may help with the logistics.

Ms. Chamberland brought to the committees attention that she is organizing a neighborhood to adopt a park/Carriage Way Park, to do cleanup, etcetera on a monthly basis. They would meet once a month and see how it goes. Ms. Chamberland will be sending out emails to see who may be interested in her neighborhood to be part of this group.

There being no additional business, Mayor Albrecht made a motion to adjourn at 8:23am Ms. Chamberland seconded the motion. All yes.

- Transfer from General Fund 101 to Parks Fund 2014 for Trailhead Foundation Wall \$3,705

Ordinance creating a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area for the City of Milford and enacting regulations

WHEREAS, effective April 30, 2017, a municipality with a population of less than thirty-five thousand is permitted to create a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) pursuant to the provisions of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 4301.82; and

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, May 21, 2019 the City Manager submitted an application to the City Council for approval in a specified section of the City of Milford (the DORA application); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to ORC Section 4301.82 (C), notice of the filing of the DORA Application with the date of a public hearing thereon was published in a newspaper of general circulation in the City on May 29, 2019 and June 5, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the public hearing on the application was held June 18, 2019 during which public testimony was held; and

WHEREAS, Section 4301.82 (F)(1) of the ORC requires the City to establish requirements that the City determines necessary to ensure public health and safety in the area and ORC Section 4301.82 (F)(2) provides for notice of this proposed action to be published in a newspaper of general circulation once a week for two consecutive weeks, such notice having been published on May 29, 2019 and June 5, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the DORA application as submitted, to include the premises of the permit holders located at the street addresses on Exhibit A, meets the requirements of the ORC Section 4301.82 (B)(1-5), it being further clarified that the boundary of the DORA includes the premises of the permit holders located at the street addresses listed on Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, approval of the DORA will serve to enhance the experiences of the patrons of the business areas and the special events within the City of Milford, Ohio:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Milford, Ohio:

Section 1. City Council approves the DORA application as having met the requirements of ORC Section 4301.82 (B)(1-5) and approves the establishment of a Downtown Milford Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area comprised of the area as depicted on Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, such area to include and encompass the premises of the permit holders located at the street addresses listed on Exhibit A, as is required to be included pursuant to ORC Section 4301.82 (F) (1) (a).

Section 2. City Council determines that all public notice requirements of ORC Section 4301.82 prior to the passage of this resolution have been met.

- Section 3. That in order to ensure public health and safety and in accordance with ORC Section 4301.82 (F)(1)(b), the number, spacing and type of signage designating the DORA boundary shall be as set forth on Exhibit B, attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- Section 4. The DORA encompasses not fewer than four qualified permit holders, all which are identified on Exhibit C, attached hereto and made a part hereof, by business name, address, liquor permit type and liquor permit number. Also included on Exhibit C and in accordance with ORC Section 4301.82 (F)(1)(c) are the hours of operation for the DORA, which will apply to all activity within the DORA.
- Section 5. The Public Health and Safety Plan as described in Exhibit D, attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby approved as meeting the requirements of ORC Section 4301.82 (F)(1)(e-f), including the manner in which the number of personnel needed to carry out the plan shall be determined.
- Section 6. The Sanitation Plan that will help maintain the appearance and public health of the area as described on Exhibit E, attached hereto and made a part hereof, is herby approved as meeting the requirements of ORC Section 4301.82 (F)(1)(e-f), including the manner in which the number of personnel needed to carry out the plan shall be determined.
- Section 7. As is required by the ORC Section 4301.82 (F)(1)(g), beer and intoxicating liquor shall only be served in plastic bottles or other plastic containers, which shall be provided by the qualified permit holders in a readily-identified container as approved by the City's Department of Public Safety.
- **Section 8.** City Council shall review the review the requirements of the DORA, as established herein, one year from the effective date of this resolution to determine whether to continue the DORA under the same or modified terms and conditions or dissolve it according to the statutory provision.
- Section 9. The Clerk of Council is hereby instructed to forward a copy of this resolution to the Ohio Division of Liquor Control and to the investigative unit of the Ohio Department of Public Safety, all in accordance with ORC Section 4301.82 (C) and Section 4301.82 (F)(3).
- **Section 10.** Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this legislation were taken in an open meeting of Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of its committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, are taken in meetings open to the public in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 122.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- **Section 11.** That this resolution shall take effect from and after the earliest time allowed by law.




