Executive Order #7: "Continuation of Current Emergency Health and Safety Orders"

The Governor's Executive Order issued earlier today, April 20, 2020, generally rescinded his previous Executive Order requiring the closure of all public beach accesses and adjacent public parking lots. In today's Executive Order, however, the Governor also authorized units of local government to take other actions deemed necessary to maintain the health, safety, and welfare of its residents.

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 8 of the Myrtle Beach Code of Ordinances, and the Declaration of Civil Emergency dated March 14, 2020, and extended on April 13, 2020, both of which were duly executed by the Mayor, I hereby order that the closure of public beach accesses and adjacent public parking lots be continued in the City of Myrtle Beach until such time as the Declaration of Civil Emergency expires, City Council takes action directing otherwise, or until rescinded by subsequent Executive Order.
