PUBLIC COMMENT

Oakland County Treasurer Andy Meisner, Berkley High School graduate, stated March 31st is the property foreclosure deadline in Michigan. He said if anyone knows someone who is in a tough financial position, this is the time to contact the County Treasurer's Office. Mr. Meisner stated there are many resources available including financial counseling, credit repair, working with mortgage companies, and working with small businesses. He pointed out some flyers that he will leave at City Hall. He discussed the Financial Empowerment Center, which is a free, discreet service offered by the County. He discussed other programs available to help families falling on hard times to maintain financial ownership. Mr. Meisner discussed the Berkley real estate market. He also discussed the local government investment pool and Berkley's participation in that program. He stated the County appreciates the City of Berkley.

Councilmember Baker asked about other outreach mechanisms utilized to reach residents. Mr. Meisner stated certified mail, home visits, a texting program, and social media from time to time. Mr. Meisner stated his phone number is 248-421-Andy.

Mayor Pro Tem Dean thanked Mr. Meisner for attending and providing the information.

RECOGNITIONS/PRESENTATIONS: Matter of any recognitions or presentations from the Consent Agenda.

PRESENTATION: Presentation by the Detroit Institute of Arts regarding the City of Berkley's participation in the Inside| Out 2020 program.

City Manager Matthew Baumgarten introduced the item and stated the City of Berkley was chosen to participate in the DIA Inside| Out 2020 program.

Amanda Harrison Keighley, DIA Community Engagement Manager, was present and went into more detail on how the City of Berkley was chosen to participate in the Inside|Out program along with another community art project.

Ms. Keighley talked about the DIA, providing details like the museum is ranked in the top five of Encyclopedic museums. She discussed what makes the DIA stand out.

Ms. Keighley discussed the Inside|Out program and stated five pieces will be placed throughout the city. She stated they have been scouting locations. She went into further detail about the program and thanked Berkley for its participation.

Ms. Keighley talked about another program, Articipate. She stated that the program will move along and will include a public input portion via survey regarding what types of art projects residents would like to see in Berkley.

Ms. Keighley discussed what is currently happening at the DIA including upcoming exhibits including "Guests of Honor: Frida Kahlo & Salvador Dali." She stated that in June, "Van Gogh in America" will visit the museum.

Ms. Keighley discussed current membership statistics and what the museum offers to everyone. She said there has been more than two million free Tri-county visits since 2012. She attributes that to the millage. She stated there has been 439,000 students at the museum via free field trips and 1,310 senior groups have visited with free transportation. She discussed the Thursday program the museum offers to senior citizens.

Ms. Keighley went into further detail on all of the DIA's community partnerships.

Ms. Keighley thanked all of the museum's volunteers. She said none of this would be possible without the volunteers, which many are trained docents.

Ms. Keighley provided a recap of the millage proposal and stated there will be a proposal on the March 10th ballot to renew the existing millage.

Councilmember Baker thanked Ms. Keighley for the DIA's service and asked for a recap of the Inside | Out timeline.

Ms. Keighley stated right now, the contracts are out and once contracts are returned they will order frames so they are ready to begin installations in May. She stated the installations will be up through November.

Councilmember Gavin thanked Ms. Keighley and City of Berkeley Public Policy Assistant Dan Hill for his work on this project.

DISCUSSION: Matter of discussing the status of the proposed Downtown Development Authority Design Guidelines and the proposed Overlay District Ordinance.

City Manager Matthew Baumgarten introduced this discussion item. He referenced the memo written by Community Development Director Erin Schlutow.

Mr. Baumgarten provided the history of the design guideline process. He stated they ran into roadblocks with implementation. He said since that time, there has been participant turnover. He discussed how the stakeholders in this matter see the process moving forward. He introduced some of the stakeholders that were in the audience that evening.

Ms. Schlutow spoke before Council and referenced her Jan. 29, 2020 memo. She said she wants to address going back and looking at this matter with fresh eyes, including what design esthetic do we want in Berkley as defined by the Planning Commission and the City Council. Ms. Schlutow went over five items that were outlined in the memo. She stated this is more of a broad overview of the changes.

Councilmember Baker said he loves this and asked if there was any feedback from the Downtown Development Authority.

Stakeholders in the audience provided input on items including the design guidelines process, limiting other board participation, etc.

Kristen Kapelanski said the Planning Commission is willing to look at this matter again. She said they are anxious to get the guidelines in place as soon as possible.

Councilmember Blanchard stated the next step is to merge the new ideas with what existed before and present to the Planning Commission. He stated we are at a point to move this forward.

Councilmember Hennen said some of his chief concerns include that it would be too vague. He said he likes the design guidelines but has concerns. Councilmember Hennen asked if there was any idea on what the cost would be to the applicant to go through this process. He also asked about the time. One question was do we have any idea of time and cost for an applicant to go through this process. It was stated costs would fall under administration costs. Ms. Schlutow stated the Review board component would be eliminated. She explained this in further detail. Hennen reconfirmed there would be no extra cost nor would there be extra time.

City Attorney John Staran added the proposed process would not be an additional layer of bureaucracy. He stated he hopes this process is more efficient.

Ms. Schlutow said she would make sure proposed plans fit within the DDA guidelines before going to the Planning Commission. She said this would help the Planning Commission meetings run shorter.

Councilmember Price thanked everyone involved. She said she fully supports getting rid of the Design Committee and moving forward with what is proposed. She asked how internally this process would happen. She asked do we need to provide an appeals process. Mr. Staran said it would be the same appeals process that applies to those going before the Zoning Board of Appeals. He said the existing process should work for this as well.

COMMUNICATIONS:

COUNCILMEMBER HENNEN: stated he attended training on how to effectively communicate concerns to state legislatures through the East Michigan Council of Governments. He said during the last Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) meeting, members denied new residential construction and allowed a second-floor addition with conditions. Councilmember Hennen discussed he was pleased with code enforcement's identification of an issue that brought this matter before the ZBA. He said the next regularly scheduled ZBA meeting is February 10. Councilmember Hennen said the Tree Board continued its discussion on its public tree inventory project. He announced that tomorrow is his public talk with Dennis event.

COUNCILMEMBER GAVIN: said the Planning Commission meeting will take place 7 p.m. February 25. He stated the next Environmental Advisory Committee (EAC) meeting will be February 20. Councilmember Gavin said the EAC along with the Berkley Public Library will provide a workshop with mirainbarrel. Please call or visit the library to register.

COUNCILMEMBER BLANCHARD: gave kudos to another very good Winterfest even though there wasn't a lot of winter. He said kids were having a great time. Councilmember Blanchard stated he attended the Off to the Races event and it was great. He stated he also attended the Chamber of Commerce ribbon cutting event at Green Lantern Pizza earlier in the day.

COUNCILMEMBER PRICE: stated the Library Board met and library circulation continues to increase. She announced upcoming programs coming to the library. She encourages people to visit the library or its website to register for upcoming programs. She stated on Feb. 11, the library will present, "History of Oakland County." She also stated there would be a bake sale fundraiser on Saturday. She said the library would be conducting a survey to gather feedback. Councilmember Price thanked everyone for coming out and participating in her conversation event. She said the next one is to be determined. She said it will be at the Community Center. Councilmember Price thanked the Berkeley and Royal Oak school districts for hosting the MLK Day of Service.

COUNCILMEMBER BAKER: discussed the Downtown Development Authority spotlight board members – two student members. For more information visit downtownberkeley.com. He discussed the recent goings on of the Historical Committee. He stated he is pleased to see Berkeley committees working together. He said the kit home display is coming soon to the Berkeley Historical Museum. He explained how houses could be ordered through a Sears catalog. He discussed in more detail the process of receiving and building a kit house. He stated the display will be ready this Wednesday. Councilmember Baker recited a quote by Patrick Young. "The trouble with weather forecasting is that it's right too often for us to ignore it and wrong too often for us to rely on it. He stated that the groundhog didn't see his shadow on Groundhog's Day, which means an early spring. Councilmember Baker asked everyone to please be careful in these changing weather conditions.

City Manager Baumgarten: announced City Hall will be closed on February 7 for in-service training. He stated that two city employees recently attended the Michigan Municipal Executives conference. He announced ALICE training is coming up for the library and community center. Mr. Baumgarten said we couldn't do any of these things without the support of the Council. Mr. Baumgarten said Parks & Recreation provided a great Winterfest. He said Theresa McArdle and her team did a great job.

City Attorney John Staran: said he looks forward to attending the annual winter meeting. He said there is a very topical agenda.

Mayor Pro Tem Dean: said she wants to jump on the Winterfest band wagon. She said it was so nice to see everyone. She said this is a free event for the community. She thanked the sponsors and said it was an uplifting time. Mayor Pro Tem Dean said Parks & Recreation will also be hosting Parents Night Out. She said to call the Community Center for more information. She said they will also be hosting February vacation camp.

of the City Council of the City of Berkley, Michigan, to Amend Sections 138-584, 138-605, 138-625, and 138-656 and to Add New Section 138-552 to Chapter 138 Zoning, of the City of Berkley Code of Ordinances to Modify and Establish the Process and Requirements for Public Hearing Notices.

THE CITY OF BERKLEY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: Section 138-584 of Chapter 138 of the Berkley Code of Ordinances shall be amended, as follows:

Sec. 138-584. – Notice of hearing.

~~Not less than 15 days' notice of time and place of such hearing shall be published at least once in the official newspaper or a newspaper of general circulation within the city not less than 15 days before such hearing. If an individual property or several adjacent properties are proposed for rezoning, notice of the hearing shall be given to the owners of the property in question and to all persons to whom real property within 300 feet of the premises is assessed and to the occupants of single family and two family dwellings within 300 feet of the premises in question. Such notice shall be delivered in person or by mail addressed to the respective owners at the address given in the last assessment roll. If the tenant's name is not known, the term "occupant" may be used. Notification need not be given to more than one occupant of the structure, except that if a structure contains more than one dwelling unit of spatial area owned or leased by different individuals, one occupant of each unit shall receive notice. In the case of a single structure containing more than four dwelling units or spatial areas leased by different individuals, notice may be sent to the manager or owner who shall be requested to post the notice at the primary entrance of the structure. The notice shall describe the nature of the request, indicate the property that is the subject of the request, state when and where the public hearing will take place, and indicate when and where written comments will be received concerning the request.~~ See Section 138-552 for public hearing notification process and requirements.

SECTION 2: Section 138-605 of Chapter 138 of the Berkley Code of Ordinances shall be amended, as follows:

Sec. 138-605. – Notice of hearing.

~~Not less than 15 days' notice of time and place of such hearing shall be published at least once in the official newspaper or a newspaper of general circulation within the city not less than 15 days before such hearing. Notice of the hearing shall be given to the owners of the property that is the subject of the request and to all persons to whom real property within 300 feet of the subject property is assessed and to the occupants of all structures within 300 feet of the subject property. Such notice shall be delivered in person or by mail addressed to the respective owners and occupants at the address given in the last assessment roll. If the occupant's name is not known, the term "occupant" may be used. Notification need not be given to more than one occupant of a structure, except that if a structure contains more than one dwelling unit or spatial area owned or leased by different persons, one occupant of each unit or spatial area shall receive notice. The notice shall be sent by mail or personal delivery to the owners of property for which the approval is being considered, to all persons to whom real property is assessed within 300 feet of the boundary of the property in question, and to the occupants of all structures within 300 feet. If the name of occupant is not known, the term "occupant" may be used in making notification. Notification need not be given to more than one occupant of the structure, except that if a structure contains more than one dwelling unit or spatial area owned or leased by different individuals, one occupant of each unit shall receive notice. In the case of a single structure containing more than four dwelling units or spatial areas leased by different individuals, notice may be sent to the manager or owner who shall be requested to post the notice at the primary entrance of the structure. The notice shall describe the nature of the request, indicate the property that is the subject of the request, state when and~~

~~where the public hearing will take place, and indicate when and where written comments will be received concerning the request~~[See Section 138-552 for public hearing notification process and requirements.](#)

SECTION 5: Section 138-552 shall be added to Chapter 138 of the Berkley Code of Ordinances, as follows:

Sec. 138-552. – Public hearing notification requirements.

- (a) *Applicability.* These provisions apply to the following requests that require a public hearing:
 - (1) Zoning text and map amendments (including rezonings);
 - (2) Appeals;
 - (3) Variances;
 - (4) Special land uses; and
 - (5) Planned unit development.
- (b) *Public notice.* The following public notice procedure shall apply to all public hearings:
 - (1) *Notice contents.* The notice shall contain the following information:
 - a. Description of the nature of the request and purpose of the public hearing;
 - b. Citation of the applicable Zoning Ordinance sections;
 - c. Address and parcel number of the subject property;
 - d. Date, time, and location of the public hearing;
 - e. When and where comments will be received concerning the request.
 - (2) *Newspaper publication.* The notice of the public hearing must be published in the official newspaper of general circulation for publication of notices within the City not less than 15 days prior to the date of the hearing.
 - (3) *Mailed notice.* The notice of the public hearing must be mailed to owners and occupants of all properties and structures within 300 feet of the subject property, including those located outside of the City limits, if applicable. Notices must be postmarked not less than 15 days prior to the date of the hearing.

Such notice shall be delivered in person or sent by first-class mail addressed to the respective owners and occupants at the address given in the last assessment roll.

If an occupant's name is not known, the term "occupant" may be used. Notification need not be given to more than one occupant of the structure, except that if a structure contains more than one dwelling unit or spatial area owned or leased by different individuals, one occupant of each unit shall be given notice. In the case of a single structure containing more than four dwelling units or other distinct spatial areas leased by different persons, notice may be given to the manager or owner of the structure who shall be requested to post the notice at the primary entrance to the structure.

- (4) *City website notice.* The notice of the public hearing shall be posted on the City's website not less than 15 days prior to the date of the hearing.
- (5) *Temporary sign on subject property.* A temporary sign providing notice of the public hearing shall be conspicuously placed in the front yard of the subject property not less than seven (7) days prior to the hearing date.
 - a. Public hearing signs shall be provided by the City of Berkley and placed on the subject property with the permission of the property owner.
 - b. If the property is located on a corner lot, a public hearing sign shall be conspicuously placed in each yard abutting a street.
 - c. If the property is located in a district without an established front or side yard, the sign may be conspicuously placed in the street-facing window of the principal structure on the subject property.

SECTION 6: Severability Clause

Should any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance be held invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 7: Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days following the date of adoption.

AN ORDINANCE

to add Division 1, Attendance and Training, to Article V of Chapter 2, Administration, of
the City of Berkley Code of Ordinances, and to Amend City Code Sections 2-273, 66-21, 86-
36, and 90-20 to Adopt Minimum Attendance and Training Requirements and to modify
removal from office procedures for Appointed Boards and Commissions.

THE CITY OF BERKLEY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: Division 1 of Article V of Chapter 2 of the City of Berkley Code of Ordinances is hereby added and adopted, as follows:

Division 1. Attendance and Training

Sec. 2-176. Definitions. As used in this division, the following terms shall be defined as follows:

- (a) *Board:* A board, commission, committee, authority, or other similar public body for the City of Berkley that is established and empowered by state constitution, statute, charter, ordinance, resolution, or rule to exercise governmental or proprietary authority or perform a governmental or proprietary function.
- (b) *Appointed Member:* A member of a board, including an alternate member, whose appointment must be made or approved by the City Council.

Sec. 2-177. Removal from office.

The City Council shall have the power to remove from office any appointed member of a board whose membership is not otherwise established or required by charter, statute or ordinance.

- (a) Appointed members of the board of review, building code board of appeals, downtown development authority, planning commission, zoning board of appeals, or any other Board whose purpose and function is not purely advisory, may after notice and hearing, be removed from office by a majority vote of the City Council for cause including misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance of office.
- (b) Appointed members of boards other than those in subsection (a), above, may be removed from office by a majority vote of the City Council without cause assigned.

Sec. 2-178. Minimum attendance required.

- (a) Before the end of each fiscal year of the city, each board shall report to the city manager the attendance record of each member during that fiscal year.
- (b) A vacancy shall occur whenever an appointed member of any board shall miss four (4) consecutive regular meetings or twenty-five percent (25%) of that board's regular

meetings held during a fiscal year of the city, unless such absences have been excused by the members of the board and the reasons therefore entered into the official record and minutes of the board.

Sec. 2 – 179. Training required for Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals.

- (a) All appointed members of the planning commission and the zoning board of appeals must:
 - (1) Complete a training course within six (6) months of their initial appointment to the board whose purpose is to provide the fundamentals on roles, responsibilities and best practices for planning and zoning in Michigan, unless such member(s) previously served on the same board within the last five (5) years; and
 - (2) Complete a minimum amount of continuing education each fiscal year beginning with the first fiscal year after their appointment, whose purpose is to provide training in advanced topics or updates on changes in planning or zoning law and best practices.
- (b) Any appointed member who fails to complete all of the requirements of this section shall be considered to have vacated their seat.
- (c) Before the end of each fiscal year, the Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals shall report to the city manager the training record of each member during that fiscal year.
- (d) The City Manager in consultation with the Community Development Director shall determine the available training courses and minimum amount of training needed to fulfill the requirements of subsection (a), above. In determining the minimum amount of training needed for a member, the city manager may take into account the member's professional credentials, skills, experience, or equivalent training.
- (e) The requirements of this section are waivable if the City Council does not appropriate sufficient funds to cover members' expense of education and training materials, classes, and related travel and lodging expenses.
- (f) In the first fiscal year after the effective date of this Division, in which the City Council appropriates sufficient funds, all appointed members of the Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals must complete the mandatory training by the end of that fiscal year, or be determined by the city manager to have completed equivalent training. Any appointed member who fails to do so shall be considered to have vacated their seat.

Sec. 2 – 180. Effective date

The requirements of ~~this division~~ sections 2-178 and 2-179 shall go into effect beginning with the fiscal year starting July 1, 2020.

SECTION 2: Section 2-273 of Division 5 of Article V of Chapter 2 of the City of Berkley Code of Ordinances is hereby amended, as follows:

Sec. 2 – 273. Removal from Office.

Members of the environmental advisory committee shall be subject to removal from office by ~~a majority vote of the council without cause assigned~~ in accordance with City Code Section 2-177, and their position shall be subject to being deemed vacant due to excessive unexcused absences under City Code Section 2-178.

SECTION 3: Section 66-21 of Article II of Chapter 66 of the City of Berkley Code of Ordinances is hereby amended, as follows:

Sec. 66 – 21. Removals from Office.

Members of the library board shall be subject to removal from office by the council ~~without cause assigned~~ in accordance with City Code Section 2-177, and their position shall be subject to being deemed vacant due to excessive unexcused absences under City Code Section 2-178.

SECTION 4: Section 86-36 of Article III of Chapter 86 of the City of Berkley Code of Ordinances is hereby amended, as follows:

Sec. 86 – 36. Removal from Office.

Members of the parks and recreation advisory board shall be subject to removal from office by ~~a majority vote of the council without cause assigned~~ in accordance with City Code Section 2-177, and their position shall be subject to being deemed vacant due to excessive unexcused absences under City Code Section 2-178. A vacancy shall occur whenever any member of the parks and recreation advisory board shall miss or fail to be present at four consecutive regular meetings or 25 percent of such meetings in any fiscal year, unless such absences shall be excused.

SECTION 5: Section 90-20 of Article II of Chapter 90 of the City of Berkley Code of Ordinances is hereby amended, as follows:

Sec. 90 – 20. Removal of members.

Members of the planning commission may, ~~after public hearing,~~ be removed by the council ~~for nonfeasance, misfeasance, or malfeasance in office. Refer to Code of Ethics ordinance~~ in accordance with City Code Section 2-177, and their position shall be subject to being deemed vacant due to excessive unexcused absences under City Code Section 2-178 or failure to complete required training under City Code Section 2-179. Refer to Code of Ethics ordinance.

SECTION 6: Severability Clause

Should any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance be held invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 7: Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective 30 days following the date of adoption.

SECTION 8: Publication

The City Council directs the City Clerk to publish a summary of this ordinance in compliance with Public Act 182 of 1991, as amended, and Section 6.5 of the Berkley City Charter.

AN ORDINANCE

**of the City Council of the City of Berkley, Michigan
to Add New Article III, Unsolicited Written Materials, to Chapter 6, Advertising,
of the City of Berkley Code of Ordinances to Regulate the Leaving or Placement of
Unsolicited Written Materials on Private Property.**

THE CITY OF BERKLEY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: Article II Handbills of the Berkley City Code is repealed in its entirety.

SECTION 2: New Article III is added to Chapter 6 of the Berkley City Code, as follows:

ARTICLE III. – UNSOLICITED WRITTEN MATERIALS

Sec. 6-60. – Purpose and intent.

The purpose and intent of this Article is to reduce visual blight, litter, and the scattering and migration to public streets or other public or private property of unsolicited written materials by establishing reasonable, predictable locations for the placement of such materials on the private property to which they are delivered. Placement of such materials in consistent, secure and predictable locations will reduce the negative visual impact of such materials, reduce the likelihood that such materials will be rendered unreadable or unusable, reduce the blowing or washing of such materials onto streets, drains, or adjoining property, reduce the likelihood that such materials will become a nuisance or blight on public and private property and public streets, and make it more likely and convenient for the intended recipients to find and collect such materials.

Sec. 6-61. – Definitions.

For purposes of this article, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

Front door. The street-facing entrance(s) to a principal building or structure. In the event no door faces the street, then a door of a principal building or structure nearest the street shall be considered a front door for purposes of this article.

Person. An individual, partnership, corporation, limited liability company, association, or other legal entity, including the partners, shareholders, proprietors, officers, or members of a company, firm, partnership, limited liability company, association and a corporation.

Porch. An exterior appendage to a principal building leading to a doorway, also known as a stoop, veranda, doorstep, or entrance platform.

Premises. A lot, plot, condominium unit, or parcel of private property including any buildings, structures, driveways, walkways, or yards.

Principal building or structure. The main building or structure where the primary use of the premises is conducted.

Unsolicited written materials. Any written materials delivered to any premises without the express request, invitation or permission, in writing or otherwise, including, but not limited to, papers, advertisements, magazines, pamphlets, flyers, handbills, leaflets, and circulars of the owner, occupant, or lessee of such premises.

Sec. 6-62. – Placement of unsolicited written materials.

Unsolicited written materials delivered to premises shall be left or placed only:

- (1) On a porch, if one exists, nearest the front door, in a manner to prevent it from being blown, washed, or drifted about the premises; or
- (2) So that such materials are securely attached to the front door; or
- (3) Through a door slot on the front door of the principal building or structure as permitted by the United States Postal Service; or
- (4) Between the exterior front door, if one exists and is unlocked, and the interior front door; or
- (5) Where permitted, in a distribution box, tube, or container located on or adjacent to the premises; or
- (6) Adjacent to postal box near the front door; or
- (7) Personally with the owner, occupant, and/or lessee of the premises.

Sec. 6-63. – Preservation of rights.

Notwithstanding Sec. 6-62 above, an owner, tenant, or occupant maintains the right to restrict entry onto the premises.

Sec. 6-64. – Rebuttable presumption.

Unsolicited written materials left or placed at premises creates a rebuttable presumption that the materials were left or placed at the premises by the owner, publisher, agent, manager, and/or authorized distributor of the unsolicited written materials.

Sec. 6-65. – Violations and limitations.

- (a) Any person who leaves or places, or who causes to be left or placed, unsolicited written materials in areas on or adjacent to premises other than as set forth in Sec. 6-62 of this article shall be responsible for a municipal civil infraction punishable by a civil fine of \$100.00 for each violation. A separate violation of this article occurs each time that unsolicited written materials are left or placed on, at, or about a separate premises in violation of this article. For example, three (3) violations of this article will occur if a person leaves or places unsolicited written materials in violation of this article at three (3) different premises.
- (b) A person shall be responsible for a violation of this article if the person directed or engaged the person's officer, agent, employee, or contractor to leave or place the unsolicited written materials. That a person acted as an officer, agent, employee, or

contractor of another in leaving or placing unsolicited written materials in violation of this article shall not negate or relieve the person acting as an officer, agent, or employee for his or her own violation of this article.

- (3) This article shall not be deemed to be violated merely because unsolicited written materials that were left or placed on, at, or about a premises in violation of this article have remained on, at, or about a premises. Only the initial leaving or placement of the unsolicited written materials in violation of this article shall constitute a violation of this article.
- (4) The provisions of this article do not apply to the United States Postal Service.

Sec. 6-66. – Other remedies.

Nothing contained in this article shall be construed to limit the City's other remedies at law or in equity to regulate or enjoin the leaving or placement unsolicited written materials that have been left or placed in violation of this article.

SECTION 3: Severability Clause

Should any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Ordinance be held invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

As part of the FY 2019-2020 budget process, funds were allocated for the purchase of a new tandem axle dump truck and associated truck bodies. This vehicle will be utilized for winter maintenance activities (salting/plowing) as well as transporting bulk materials. The new unit will replace a 1998 Chevrolet dump truck (#36).

We propose to utilize the existing MITN cooperative bid for this purchase. A few years ago, eight communities joined forces to develop a comprehensive request for proposals (RFP), via MITN, for dump trucks and related snow equipment. Submittals were reviewed by the eight communities with the City of Rochester Hills acting as the lead agency. The focus was to select vendors that offered the best value with consideration for quality, workmanship, costs, training and capacity to meet demand. Ultimately, Wolverine Freightliner (Mt. Clemens, Michigan) was selected for the chassis and Truck & Trailer Specialties (Howell, Michigan) for the dump bodies and snow-fighting equipment. To date over 200 trucks have been purchased by more than 35 road agencies in southeast Michigan using this multi-year cooperative bid.

DPW staff has reviewed the multiple options available via MITN and selected a Freightliner tandem axle chassis, SwapLoader Hooklift hoist, Monroe stainless steel hopper and salt spreader, Monroe plows, Crysteel stainless dump body, Poynette container body and a flatbed stake body (please see attached for details).

The dump truck comes with a minimum one year warranty for parts and labor (no deductible). In addition, the Cummins engine has a five year/100,000 miles extended factory warranty and the Allison transmission has a 5 year/unlimited miles extended factory warranty.

We recommend moving forward with the 2020 dump truck and truck bodies purchase from Wolverine Freightliner and Truck & Trailer Specialties, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$315,492 utilizing the MITN Cooperative Bid Contract.

The unit was programmed in the 2019-2020 Capital Equipment Replacement Plan. Funds are allocated in the 2019-2020 Fiscal Budget under account number 101-441-985-000 (Vehicles-\$325,000).

This new system will supplement our existing mainline sewer tractor giving us the capability to view smaller sewer lines within the public right-of-way. The package will include the launch module, camera, tractor wheels, cable, propulsion pushrod, software upgrades, installation and training.

We currently operate RapidView IBAK sewer inspection equipment that was originally purchased in 2014. IBAK is the world's oldest and largest pipeline inspection manufacturer, inventing the sewer camera back in the 1950's. The IBAK line has proven to be a dependable resource with flexible components.
