Guidelines & Checklist for Evaluation of a
PROJECT or SERVICES REQUEST FORM for Unsolicited Proposals

Introduction

This document of guidelines and a checklist is intended for use in evaluating Project or Services Request Forms for Unsolicited Proposals submitted to the Parks & Recreation Department Director, as well as the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board. It is anticipated that use of these guidelines and the checklist will save time, effort and resources in considering unsolicited proposals, making City government respond more effectively to citizens.

This document is made available to citizens and those considering submitting a Project or Services Request Form to provide a clear understanding of the evaluation process. To ensure widespread availability of this document, the Department of Parks & Recreation has placed this document on the City of Taneytown web site, www.taneytown.org, and provided copies in the Taneytown Library.

Users please note, if a conflict between City policy or ordinances and this document occurs, the policy or ordinance takes precedence and should be relied upon. When citing a legal requirement, the responsible City official or other user should cite the ordinance, regulation or law, not this document. Conducting a reasonable and orderly evaluation of unsolicited proposals is critical to being responsive to the recreational needs of the citizens of Taneytown and the business of government.

If there are instances where staff or the Advisory Board requires more information or has a question about City policy, they will inquire to the Department Director.

Criteria for Evaluating Proposed Projects or Services

The Department of Parks & Recreation uses the following basic criteria to evaluate unsolicited proposals. In general, most unsolicited proposed projects or services will need to meet all of the following six criteria:

1. ***Children are a priority:*** Serve children and youths of the community as a priority, and also all city residents;
2. ***Meet City Standards:*** Be able to be developed and implemented to Taneytown Parks & Recreation standards;
3. ***Consistent with Park Use:*** Be consistent with existing uses or services or currently planned uses or services, or be more urgently needed;
4. ***Respect the Park:*** Reflect the character of the park and surroundings;
5. ***Environmental Quality:*** Enhance the park without hindering the quality of the open space; and
6. ***Adequate Funding:*** Have an anticipated, identified, independent source of funding to meet the proposal budget.

Proposal Evaluation

The Department of Parks & Recreation considers long term strategies, plans, and improvements, as well as legal requirements, in evaluating proposals. With the above criteria in mind, evaluators will proceed to answer the following questions based upon information provided in the request form submitted and Department records.

1. How did the requestor determine the need for this proposed project or service? _____

2. Is the proposed project or service consistent with and fit within existing planning documents (e.g., park master plan, facility plans, etc.)?
