Item #1 - The meeting of the Public Works Committee was called to order at 7:14 p.m.

Item #2 – CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL PUBLIC WORKS

COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON OCTOBER 9, 2018 – Motion was made by Chairman Younker, seconded by Trustee Brady, to approve the minutes of the Special Public Works Committee meeting held on October 9, 2018. Vote by voice call. Chairman Younker declared the motion carried.

Item #3 – DISCUSS CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 FOR LED STREET LIGHTING REPLACEMENT FOR PHASE 2 PROJECT WITH MEADE ELECTRIC – A contract was awarded to Meade Electric on June 12, 2018, in the amount of \$214,438.97, for the LED Street Lighting Replacement – Phase 2 project. Public Works completed phase 1 of the LED Street Lighting Replacement project in FY-2017, which included approximately 400 street lights. Currently, phase 2 is nearing completion, which would consist of approximately 254 street lights, however, the proposed change order includes an additional 123 street lights to the Phase 2 project, including pole covers and fuse kits.

Scope of work includes demolition and removal of existing HID-type fixtures, verification of current electrical code standards and necessary repair or replacement of luminaires with specified LED-type fixtures. Work consists of removal and replacement of street lighting luminaires within specified areas as well as necessary related repairs for work completion.

Funding is available in the approved FY-19 Capital Projects Budget in the amount of \$130,641.03. Additionally, ComEd reserved an incentive in the amount of \$42,616.70, for the current LED Street Lighting Replacement – Phase 2 project.

Bettenhausen, Village Treasurer stated a multiuse path will be completed as one of the final projects of the Oak Park Avenue TIF (Tax Increment Financing), however, in designing the project the engineers identified the need of an additional 163 sq. ft., for which the owner will donate to the Village.



Presented for December 4th, 2018 Village Board Agenda discussion and possible action:

Description:

Currently Public Works has completed Phase One and Two of the LED Street Lighting Replacement Project in FY 2017/2018, which included approximately 777 street lights. The LED Street Lighting Replacement Project will continue to benefit the village in multiple ways. The benefits include but are not limited to:

- Live notification of outages (Not relying on Village Staff Inspections/Reports).
- Actual energy consumption reports (Not assumed by ComEd).
- Energy savings of approximately \$77 \$124 per light head (Annually)
- Maintenance savings of approximately \$53 \$55 per light head (Annually)
- Based on the energy and maintenance savings, our expected return on this
 investment is expected to have a payback of less than six (6) years.
- Damage / Knock-down instant notification.
- Supplying manufacturer offers 10 year warranty on product.
- Reduction in maintenance requirements allow for staff to redirect toward infrastructure repairs.

Public Works requests consideration to purchase 126 new high efficient LED light heads to replace existing lights within the boundaries of the Convention Center TIF District (Parking lots, residential roads, and main roads). Sufficient funds are available under the TIF to support this purchase.



Background:

Purchase consists of all applicable items to replace/retrofit new LED light heads on existing High Pressure Sodium/Metal Halide/Mercury light heads within the specified areas of the Oak Park Avenue (Convention Center) TIF District, please reference the attached drawing for further clarification.

Cobra Head Lights (70) = \$ 49,000




