The bench was designed to resemble a car and features a real bumper, with real cloth and hats to add dimension to the characters. The back of the bench features the iconic Stateville Prison featured in the movie.

About the Artist: Nick has lived in Tinley Park for more than 60 years. He taught high school art at Bolingbrook High School for 34 years and has participated in the Benches on the Avenue program for 12 years, having created 35 benches during that time.

This bench is comprised of paint, fabric, lights, plywood and polish. About the Artist: Tinley Park High School seniors Gabrielle Ciuteikis and Jacob Diaz teamed up to create this bench, which is their first for the Benches on the Avenue program. Both students combined their own styles to create a unified, vibrant design that catches the eye.

This bench design contains many music notes and tries to tell a story with song. The bench attempts to depict how music goes into our hearts and makes us love and feel loved, and features the quote, "Music speaks when words fail." Featured bands on the mp3 player include Third Eye Blind, Green Day, Papa Roach, My Chemical Romance, Panic at the Disco, Nirvana, Linkin Park and Three Days Grace.

About the Artist: Hailey and Isabella attend Tinley Park High School. Both love the Benches on the Avenue program and said they are happy for, "the chance to be a part of something so pretty."





Oldies But Goodies Artist: The Painted Turtle

The bench is painted with acrylic paint and wooden add-ons that give the jukebox and record their distinctive shape. with disabilities. Painted Turtle artists have an endless passion to create. This is the first year the group has participated in Benches on the Avenue, and the students couldn't be more excited.





The Wordsmith **Artist:** *Marty Rose*

The blacksmith forges metals into useful tools. So, too, does the wordsmith. He performs his craft by forging words into powerful instruments that can express something as delicate as an emotion, or influential enough to change the course of history. Musician Bob Dylan is the poet laureate whose accolades reflect that craft in songs such as "Knocking on Heaven's Door," "Like a Rolling Stone" and "Blowin' in the Wind." This bench is made of plywood and acrylic paint.

About the Artist: Marty is one of the original bench artists. He believes Tinley Park's art project is far superior to any other villages, and is part of a true modern day renaissance.
