## Contractors:

- A State of Illinois 060 License and a State of Illinois 055 Plumbing License and an employee list with copies of all 061 State of Illinois licenses are required. Permits will not be issued unless all contractors noted on the permit are licensed and bonded. At any time during the permit approval process or during construction after permit is approved and issued a decision is made to change any contractor listed on the application, a Change of Contractor form must be completed and submitted to the Building Department. Verification of the new contractor's license and bond status as current must be confirmed by the Village before work on the project can resume.

## RULES ESTABLISHED BY THE ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

Public Act 91-678(HB 539) requires persons who install lawn sprinkler systems to register with the Department as irrigation contractors and to register their employees who install or supervise the installation of lawn sprinkler systems. The public act also requires the registration of all lawn sprinkler systems that are installed in the state after January 26, 2000.

The Department finds that a threat to the public interest, safety and welfare exists for the adoption of these rules to ensure that licensed plumbers supervise the installation of lawn sprinkler systems and make the physical connection between sprinkler systems and back flow prevention devises to prevent contamination of drinking water supplies.

An RPZ certification is required before the system is activated and a yearly certification of the RPZ valve by a State Licensed Cross Connection Certified Plumber is required. A written statement is to be submitted to the Public Works Department.

Failure to comply with any portion of our ordinance will result in termination of all water service
