Lake Street Redevelopment to Honor Veterans

The Village has begun plans for redevelopment of one of the most visible corners in Addison, the southwest corner of Lake Street and Addison Road.

Mayor Rich Veenstra announced that it will be the new site of the Veterans monument and extension of the Village Green. The open space will include brick paver walkways, lighting, flagpoles and irrigation. The monument itself will include the relocation of Veterans Circle, currently at the northeast corner of the intersection.

The project is made possible through a land swap with Panattoni Development Corporation, giving them ownership of a parcel at Addison Road and Moreland Ave.

This parcel was formerly the BetterBilt factory; the Village acquired this property before the Great Recession as part of now defunct Town Center plan.

“Allowing this corner, which is really a gateway to the center of town, to remain open to our community was really an easy decision,” Mayor Veenstra said. “It’s also a much better location for a monument to those who have served our country.”

The project cost will be funded by new development within the Town Center Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District, which was established in 2006 as a method of funding public improvements within the Lake St. and

Addison Road corridor, meaning there will be no property tax increase, Veenstra said.

Specifications are still being drawn by Hitchcock Design of Naperville, the company used to design the Village Green improvements over the past several years, but the Village tentatively plans to dedicate the monument for Veterans Day 2023.

History of the Property

The property has great historical significance, according to the archive records of the Addison Historical Society. A historical marker is planned for the project.

The land was the site of Addison’s first public school, built around 1858. It was called the “English School” because classes were taught in English, as opposed to German, which was used in the Lutheran schools.

When a new public school was built on Oak Street to the north in 1880, the school was remodeled into a private residence and eventually became known as the “Green Property,” when Edward H. Green and his wife Jane purchased the land in 1948.

After Mrs. Green’s death in 1999, the home was passed down to their son, Edward Green, Jr. Upon his death in September 2018, the home was transferred to the third generation of the Green family.



Code Enforcement is for Everyone

Property maintenance codes contribute to the well-being of our community. The preservation of life and safety, as well as the maintenance of property values over time, are a direct result of the application and enforcement of property maintenance codes.

The Village of Addison has adopted the 2018 International Property Maintenance Code which applies to all existing buildings, structures and properties within our community. This code addresses property maintenance standards ranging from plumbing to electrical, mechanical and fire safety. They include: making sure grass is cut regularly, painting the exterior surfaces of buildings when needed, properly displaying your address so it can be visible to police and fire department personnel, preventing trash, garbage and refuse from accumulating, limiting the number of occupants that reside in a residence and many more.

Addison Community Television Marks 40 Years



On Sept. 19, 1982, the first public access program produced for the Addison cable television audience was presented over the Centel Cable Television system.

Addiscene, the name given to that first program, was developed by a committee whose goal was to launch local cable programming.

The name and format of *Addiscene* is credited to Dale Bower, then a speech and media studies teacher at Addison Trail High School. In 1981, Bower was hired by Centel as an educational consultant to develop an internship program for local high school students and recent graduates interested in media production. The first interns in the program were Addison residents Dale Belanger and Don Weiss.

During the summer of 1982, Bower and Weiss concluded that a program encompassing the entire community would be in order. A program that covered all of Addison through multiple scenes within one program...*Addiscene*.

The first production was also completed with the technical assistance of Addison business

owner, Cable Television Commission member, and industrial video expert Thomas Ehler.

The first hour-long program featured segments on the future delivery of Lake Michigan water to DuPage County, a new computer system at the Addison Public Library, the upcoming Lions Club Candy Days, and a preview of the weekend's Community Days Festival with Community Council of Addison president Don Jessen.

As the cable industry grew at lightning-speed nationwide, with more channels, new technology and the concept of "narrowcasting" to specific audiences, so too did Addison's early years of cable programming.

Within the first few years of programming Village Board meetings began live, gavel-to-gavel telecasts; other live programs including the Addison Community Switchboard Telethon and Addison Chamber of Commerce's *Meet the Candidates* became must-see TV; the Village hired Weiss as the first employee to work on cable franchise issues and government-access programming; and local cable programming was branded with a new name: Addison Community Television.

By the mid-1980s, Addison's cable operations moved into the Village Hall at 131 W. Lake St. Staffing was increased, and funding from the cable company for capital and operations was appropriated.

To stay competitive, 24 hours-a-day, 7 days-a-week programming was launched. The idea, pushed strongly by Ehler, further established ACTV as a part of the community fabric where residents could tune in anytime and be a part of Addison, right from home.





How to Get a Library Card

What do I need to get a library card?

To register yourself or your child for a library card, you need a photo ID with your current address. If your photo ID doesn't have your current address, please bring in an item from the proof of address list on addisonlibrary.org/get-a-card.

Any student in grades 6-12 under the age of 18 can sign up for a Teen Limited Access card without a parent or guardian. A Teen Limited Access card allows you to borrow a charging cable and a combination of up to three library materials at a time: books, video games, DVDs/Blu-rays, CDs, audiobooks, and items from the Library of Things collection. To sign up, show us your school ID and fill out a library card application.

Does it cost anything to get a library card?

Residents of incorporated Addison can sign up for their library card at no cost. Residents of unincorporated Addison may purchase a library card for a fee that will be calculated using your property tax bill. This calculated fee is based on a formula determined by the Illinois State Library and is equal to the percentage of property taxes incorporated residents automatically pay.

Free library cards are available to any student living in an unincorporated area whose household falls at or below the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Income Eligibility Guidelines.



SMOKE DETECTOR

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), nearly three out five (60%) home fire deaths were a result of fires without a smoke detector or without a working smoke detector. The Addison Fire District recommends that smoke detectors are:

- * Installed on every level of your home, including the basement
- * Inside and outside of every sleeping area for added protection
- * Following the instructions on the package for installation and maintenance
- * Tested each month, by simply pressing the "Test" button
- * Replaced if they are more than 10 years old

CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR

Carbon Monoxide (CO) is a gas that can come from heating and cooking devices in the home. Carbon monoxide is poisonous gas and has been called "The Invisible Killer" because it is odorless and colorless, making it invisible to the human senses. It can make a person feel sick and can be deadly. The Addison Fire District recommends that CO detectors are:

- * Installed on every level of the home
- * Outside sleeping areas
- * Following the instructions on the package for installation and maintenance
- * Tested each month
- * Replaced if they are more than 10 years old

SMOKE & CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR INSTALLATION PROGRAM
