





A Message from the Mayor ...


Dear Friends,

Electronic Permit Application Process Launches

Web Portal Allows for Increased Speed, Service and Transparency

In December, the Village of Addison launched the new electronic Web Portal for residents and contractors to apply for Business Licenses, Rental Housing applications, Permit applications, Planning applications and the submission of service requests. The Portal is powered by the software company *CityView on* AddisonAdvantage.org.

The Web Portal allows users to upload all documents electronically and make payments through the Portal without having to physically come into the Village Hall. Residents and contractors can complete these processes from the comfort of their own homes.

Portal users can see live updates on the status of their applications and requests. The software will cut down on permit review times and improve customer service.

CityView allows the Community Development Department to operate almost completely paperlessly. Staff members have iPads to use out in the



field for inspections, and reports can be downloaded by users in real time.

Lastly, the Portal allows for greater transparency and dialogue with staff.

Those applying for a new permit will need to create an online Portal

account with a valid email address. Applications and PDF documents will be submitted using this account.

Looking Ahead to 2023 Projects and Development

Veterans Circle Monument – southwest corner of Lake Street & Addison Road. Dedication planned for Veterans Day, November 11.

A&W Restaurant – 1012 N. Rohlwing Road (near Sams' Club). A spring opening is planned.

The Highlands subdivision – former Driscoll High School property, southeast corner of Lombard Road and Holtz Avenue. The subdivision is scheduled for completion in the fall.

Missner Group warehouse – 50 S. Fairbank Street. Completion is expected in fall.

Park Avenue, and a section of Winthrop Avenue – between Vista & Lincoln, watermain replacement. Planned for this spring.

Armitage Avenue sidewalk extension. Funded through a "Safe Routes to Schools" grant, expected to be under construction this year.



This spring the Addison Police Department hosts the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training class for Addison residents.

The class will be held every Wednesday evening for nine weeks beginning on March 1, with the last class on April 26.

The CERT program educates volunteers about disaster preparedness for the hazards that may impact their area. It trains them in basic disaster response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

Holiday Garbage Collection

Residents are sometimes confused about which holidays may alter the regular garbage collection schedule.

In the event of a weekday holiday (New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas *only*) garbage service will be delayed one day for the rest of that week.

Other holidays, such as Presidents Day, Veterans Day, etc., do not affect the schedule.

Addison Stays Connected to O'Hare Noise Monitoring Group

The O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission was established 25 years ago as a partnership between the City of Chicago and the communities and school districts within the region of O'Hare International Airport.

The Village of Addison has been a municipal member of the Commission since 2016. The Commission serves as a liaison between area communities, the Chicago Department of Aviation and Federal Aviation Administration regional office on matters of airport noise; it also receives updates on airport modernization projects and aviation technology.

Recently, ONCC heard a report from the Department of Aviation on the O'Hare 21 International Gateway Terminal Area Plan.

The Plan is to improve airport passengers' curb-to-gate travel experience at O'Hare by addressing five long-term needs: maintain operational efficiency for existing and future demand; provide increased gate flexibility; reduce aircraft taxiing and time waiting for a gate; cohesively integrate terminal facilities; and provide improved domestic and international airline and passenger connections.

The Department of Aviation compiles monthly reports on airport operations, fleet mix and runway usage, and noise monitoring. Residents impacted by airport noise are encouraged to call 1-800-914-8537 or visit oharenoise.org to register a complaint.

Spring Recycling Event

The Village of Addison Public Works Department is partnering with Republic Services, USMe, SCARCE, ProShred, Addison VFW, and Addison Trail High School to host the semi-annual recycling event.

The event will be held on Saturday, March 25, from 8 a.m. until noon at Addison Trail High School.

At the event, the Village will also give away three different types of native tree saplings to Addison residents for planting, while supplies last.

This event is open to Addison residents free of charge; proof of residency required.

Branch Pickup Schedule April through November

The Village's Branch Pick-up program is truly a service to residents. It encourages owners to pride themselves in the health, aesthetics and value of their home, building, surrounding yard and landscape. It promotes the community's desire to beautify our neighborhoods while maintaining safe and healthy surroundings.

Each month, April through November, residents may place branches at curb-side in front of their property. This may range from a single broken branch, to the pick-up removal of an entire tree, cut up and stacked as specified under the program's requirements.

To qualify for the Village's Branch Pickup Program, branches must be on the parkway the Sunday before the scheduled pickup week. Contracted crews will pass down each street only one time, and only one collection will be made Village-wide per month. Branch pickup will begin on the first Monday of each month, April through November, and finish by the end of the week, regardless of where you reside within the Village.

2023 Branch Pickup Dates

April 3 May 1 June 5 July 3 August 7 September 5* October 2

November 6

*Pick up day is delayed by one day (to Tuesday) due to the holiday.

The requirements for Branch Pickup are as follows:

- Branches must be placed curbside on the parkway, not in the street, stacked in one direction, with the thicker ends facing the street. DO NOT cross stack branches.
- Branches are limited to 8 feet in length and 8 inches in diameter.
- Limbs larger than 8 inches in diameter must be cut into 16-inch log lengths and placed separate from the branches.
- Branches should not be tied with string, wire, etc.
- Branch piles containing root balls, lumber, metal, glass, yard waste or other debris, as
 well as large branch mounds that have been multi-directionally cross stacked, will not
 be picked up.
- Branches should not be stacked in the alley or along private drives. These will not be picked up.
- No contractor cuttings will be picked up. Trees and branches cut by a privately contracted company, or individuals hired by the property owners do not qualify for the Branch Pickup Program, and must be properly disposed of by said private contractor, or other private service.
- Branch piles should not be placed on the parkway prior to or after the weekend prior to pick-up. All branches must be stored in the back yard until then.

Indian Trail Brings New Innovation to Students and Staff!





How to Convert Your Old Film

Do you have old home movies and photos lying around in your storage closets? Most tapes, film, and photos last for about 20 to 30 years, so don't wait: **come to the Sound Studio to convert your family memories into digital files at no cost!**

The Sound Studio has equipment to convert:

- 8mm and Super 8 film reels
- VHS and VHS-C tapes, both American (NTSC) and European (PAL)
- Video 8 and Hi8 camcorder cassettes
- · Vinyl records
- Audio cassette tapes
- 35mm film negatives
- 35mm slide negatives
- Photo prints

While most equipment must be used in the Sound Studio, the library also offers equipment you can borrow and take home. To learn more about converting your old film or to learn how to use the equipment, request an appointment at addisonlibrary.org/appointments.


1,000 BOOKS BEFORE KINDERGARTEN

What is 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten?

This reading initiative helps children develop literacy skills during their early years so they can be more successful when they start school!

Who can participate? How do I sign up?

Any child who has not yet entered kindergarten can sign up for 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten. To sign up, visit the library and go to our Children's Services desk on the first floor. When you register your child, you'll receive a tote bag filled with goodies, as well as a log for your first 100 books. Every child who completes the program receives a certificate and prize!



1,000 Books Before Kindergarten is self-paced, so how long the program takes depends on how often you read together. For example:

1 book per day x 3 years = 1095 books 3 books per day x 1 year = 1095 books 10 books per week x 2 years = 1040 books

Every book counts toward your total! You can read the same book multiple times, read books you own, or read books you borrow from the library, and even log books read to your child at library story times.

SMOKE & CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

Since January 1st, single and multi-family homes that are still using smoke alarms with removable batteries are required to install new alarms that feature 10-year sealed battery alarms. Homes built after 1988 that have hardwired smoke alarms, wireless integrated alarms, Wi-Fi or other Wireless Local Area Networking capability do not need to make the switch.

If you have hardwired smoke alarms in your home, you can purchase hardwired alarms with a 10-year sealed battery backup.

Smoke detectors should be tested once a month and be maintained according to manufacturer's instructions.

Make sure everyone in the home understands the sound of the smoke detector and knows how to respond.

CO detectors should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes or standards.

Test CO alarms at least once a month; replace them according to the manufacturer's instructions.

The Addison Fire Protection District can provide "free" smoke and CO detectors, including installation to eligible residents.





RESIDENTIAL KNOX BOX PROGRAM

A key box is commercially made, secure steel box in which residents can place the keys to their home for rapid access by emergency crews. These boxes are then secured to the resident's home. These boxes can only be accessed by Fire District personnel by a single key that is securely kept locked on all fire apparatus.
