Former Village Trustee William Lynch and his wife, Adele will be



Village Green Phase 5 Project

On April 3, the Village Board approved a contract with R.W. Dunteman of Addison for construction of phase 5 of the Village Green Improvement Project. This phase will include relocation of the Veterans Monument, currently at the northeast corner of Lake St. and Addison Rd., to the southwest corner of the intersection. This will extend the Village Green east to Addison Road and make for a more accessible location for the Veterans Circle monument. Construction will continue throughout the summer with a formal dedication of the new site on Veterans Day, November 11.

A historical marker will be installed, noting the site of the first English language public school in Addison in 1858.

The project was designed by Hitchcock Design of Naperville, the architect and designer of the Village Green Improvement Project. Photo renderings are provided by Hitchcock Design.



Best Wishes on Retirement

At the April 17 Addison Village Board meeting, Mayor Rich Veenstra, Village Trustees, staff and residents congratulated Trustee William "Bill" Lynch on the occasion of his retirement after 21 years of service on the Village Board. Mr. Lynch previously served 12 years on the Village's Plan Commission and Citizens Advisory Council. The Village of Addison extends best wishes to Trustee Lynch and Mrs. Adele Lynch for their service to the community of Addison.

Summer Road Construction



This year the Village of Addison will once again oversee two roadway projects, as well as a watermain replacement project. The first project will take

place in the Kings Point

subdivision, which includes Kings Point Drive (North, South, West and East), Cambridge Row, Wyncroft Place, Harrow Court, and Rumple Lane.

The work will include full depth patching, underdrain installation, and various concrete items.

The second roadway project to begin later in the year, will be the many streets of Foxdale subdivision, as well as Sleepy Hollow, Ardmore Ave., and Comstock Ave. Tally Ho Drive and Foxdale Drive will be done at a later date.

The work for this project will include patching, drainage improvements, various concrete items, and resurfacing.

Watermain and roadway improvements are also planned for Michael Lane, Lullo Drive and Rozanne Drive, with partial CDBG funding secured. This project will completely replace the aging watermain and improve the road with patching, various concrete items, and resurfacing.



RxBOX - HOPEDUPAGE

Launched by the DuPage County Health Department in 2009, the RxBOX program offers residents a safe, easy way to drop off unwanted medications that might otherwise have been misused or gone to waterways and land-fills. Unwanted medicine can be dropped off at any DuPage County RxBOX location.



Disposing Meds Safely

Proper disposal of unused medications protects the environment and saves lives. Bring your expired and unused medications to an RxBOX location that is convenient for you. The medications will then be incinerated in collaboration with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency using state-of-the-art technology.

Disposing Instructions:

- Bring household medication including over-the-counter, prescription medications, ointments and liquid medications that are expired or no longer wanted. Also drop off asthma inhalers.
- You can bring medications as they are in their original containers or, for spill-free disposal, place the pills or liquid medication bottles in a zipper top plastic bag.
- Cross off any personal information on the label or remove them to reduce concerns about personal identification information.
- As an alternative, you may empty pills directly into a zipper top plastic bag to further protect your personal information and dispose or recycle the empty pill bottle at home.
- Then, deposit your medications in the collection container marked "RxBOX" in a participating law enforcement facility.

The following items are not accepted in the drop-box:

- Medical waste
- Radioactive medicines
- Household chemical waste
- Sharps, needles, or syringe



"Sharps" is a generic term used for any medical item that is sharp and can puncture skin, such as: Hypodermic needles. EpiPens®, Lancets and other items used for home glucose monitoring. In addition, anyone who treats or monitors conditions such as diabetes, arthritis, or cancer at home may use sharps to do so.
