Prime Development

In 2019, Logistics Property Company (LPC), a major warehouse developer, acquired several unincorporated properties on the southeast corner of Lake Street and Swift Road. The properties were annexed into the Village and were readied for redevelopment. LPC recently landed a deal with Amazon to build their Delivery Services facility, a 186,000 sq. ft. building. Amazon will utilize the remaining land space as fleet van parking.



Pandemic Response

In response to increasing numbers of infections, under Mayor Veenstra's leadership the Village of Addison worked collaboratively with DuPage High School District 88 and Addison School District 4 to address the spread of COVID-19. Working with other municipalities, a decision was made locally to bring essentials to the community and encourage the 3Ws – washing hands, watching distance and wearing a mask. Residents were provided with the tools to put these measures into practice. In the first month alone, nearly 2,000 COVID Essentials Kits, assembled with assistance from the Addison Park District Senior Club, were distributed. These kits include a mask, hand sanitizer, educational literature, and more. Distribution will continue until kits run out.





Addison will host Santa Claus himself, riding through neighborhoods on a fire truck Saturday, Dec. 5 and 19.

"Now more than ever, I think our children need something to celebrate," said Mayor Rich Veenstra. "And while Santa won't be available for one-on-one visits, he will travel through Addison to bring some Christmas cheer."

In addition, Santa will help light the Christmas Tree on the Village Green following the first parade. Tune into our YouTube Channel (VillageAddison) to watch the Virtual Christmas Tree Lighting at 7:30 p.m. on Dec. 5.

Both of the Christmas Parades will start from the Addison Police Department at 4:30 p.m. and slowly wind their way through subdivisions and neighborhoods. Each route is expected to take two to three hours to complete.

On Saturday, Dec. 5, the Christmas Parade will wind through Michael Lane, Farmwood, Foxdale, College Blvd., Green Ridge, Goldengate, Westwood and Green Oaks Court neighborhoods.

On the second Saturday, Dec. 19, the parade will visit Lake Manor, Heritage, Stone Hedge, Home Addison, Normandy Manor, Ardmore/Armitage and Oak Knoll neighborhoods.

Enjoy the holiday lights and come outside to wave to Santa during one of the Christmas Parades. Face coverings and social distancing guidelines are encouraged.

The Village Reminds You ...

Village Offices are Open: Village Hall is closed to the public, due to the pandemic, but Village employees are on the job and ready to assist. Finance and Community Development Department staff are working out of the former dispatch center in the Police Department lobby, which has its own walk-up window.


White Drop Box: located in front of Village Hall, near the fountain, the white drop box is a convenient way to drop off payments by check for utility billing, tickets, vehicle stickers or other fees. Place check and remittance stub in an envelope, drive up, drop off and drive away.



Christmas Tree Removal: Christmas tree pickup service is available throughout January. Please place your Christmas tree on the parkway on Sunday night for collection by Village crews on Monday. Nails, tinsel, ornaments and lights must be removed, along with Christmas tree bags and tree bases. Evergreen wreaths and garland containing wire will not be accepted.

Employee of the Quarter Program: If you know of a Village employee that you feel is deserving of recognition, we would love to hear from you. The Village Board will recognize those who have gone out of their way to be helpful, and have gone above and beyond what their job calls for.

Winter Safety: The Public Works Department's Snow Plan is available at AddisonAdvantage. org/living_in/new_resident_information/snow_routes.php. Most important for residents to understand is the sequence of road clearing, with priority given to major arterial and high volume streets. Residents should be aware that there is no parking allowed on main arterials after 2 inches



of snowfall, and there is a total ban on all street parking after 4 inches, to allow for snow plows to get through. Plow operators do their best, but sometimes mailboxes are damaged during plowing, Please be sure that the face of your mail box is 12 inches from the back of the curb to allow for proper clearance. If your mailbox is damaged, notify Public Works at 630-620-2020.




A Bit of Addison History Available Now for Purchase
