





approximately two to three hours to complete.



# Environmental Recognitions

The Village of Addison was recognized on Sept. 19 for its initiatives in environmental sustainability, operations and conservation by both DuPage County, and by SCARCE, the county's environmental and recycling agency.

County Board Member Sam Tornatore (far right,) a member of the Board's Stormwater Committee, also presented Mayor Rich Veenstra with a County Board resolution congratulating Addison on receiving the Earth Flag and Water Quality Flag honors.

With the cold weather approaching, please remember some simple steps to help protect your vehicle.

Never leave your vehicle running with the keys in it, and lock it even when on your driveway. Criminals are opportunists, and motor vehicle thefts increase during the cold winter months as residents keep their unlocked cars running.

Never leave valuables in plain view.

The Addison Police Department would also like to alert residents to the increasing number of catalytic converter thefts in Addison and surrounding towns, and the violence associated with these crimes.

Catalytic converters are typically removed using power tools, and there are often multiple offenders involved.

If you hear suspicious noises in the middle of the night, call 9-1-1 immediately, and do not approach anyone near your vehicle.

As the temperatures drop, keep an eye on your neighbors or anyone who may need assistance. Contact the police department with any concerns. See something, say something.

## Curbside Christmas Tree Removal Throughout January

Christmas tree pickup service is available throughout the month of January.

The Public Works Department will conduct a Village-wide sweep beginning each Monday in January.

Please place your Christmas tree on the parkway on Sunday night for collection by Village crews on Monday. The Christmas tree pickup program will end after the last Monday in January.

Nails, tinsel, ornaments and lights must be removed, along with Christmas tree bags and tree bases.

Artificial trees, evergreen wreaths and garland containing wire will not be accepted.

These trees will go through the

wood chipper, and the prohibited items can cause damage to the chipper machine. The debris also pollutes the wood chips, which are eventually turned into mulch for residents.

## ELYSSA'S MISSION SOS SIGNS OF SUICIDE PROGRAM


Elyssa's Mission SOS Signs of Suicide program teaches students and staff how to recognize the signs of suicide using the ACT technique, which stands for Acknowledge, Care and Tell. Through that program, students are screened during the school year and identified for supports.

#### **PUPIL PERSONNEL SERVICES (PPS) STAFF**

The PPS team at Addison Trail consists of school counselors, social workers, psychologists, deans and nurses to support students.

#### STUDENT GROUPS

Student groups provide an environment where students feel safe and can discuss the issues they are facing. A variety of topics are offered each year, including grief/loss, social skills, anger management and anxiety.





#### **REFERRALGPS**

ReferralGPS is a free, web-based service that assists students, staff and community members in finding local treatment for mental health and substance use needs. Along with a searchable database, ReferralGPS provides appointment setting, follow-up care and help for families in triage.

(425 ILCS 60/3) Smoke Detector Act

Effective January 1, 2023, single and multi-family homes that are still using smoke alarms with removable batteries are required to install new alarms that feature 10-year sealed battery alarms.

These 10-year sealed battery alarms can be purchased at any home improvement store or online.

Check the information below to see if you are eligible free detector program.

Need help with installing? Contact us for that too.

Homes built after 1988 that already have hardwired smoke alarms and homes with wireless integrated alarms that use low-power radio frequency communications, Wi-Fi or other Wireless Local Area Networking capability do not need to make the switch. If you have hardwired smoke alarms in your home, you can purchase hardwired alarms with a 10-year sealed battery backup.

#### What to do with the old smoke alarms?

It depends on the type of smoke alarm. Look on the back of the detector. If it is "Photoelectric", throw it out with the regular trash. If it is "Ionization" or a combination (Photoelectric and Ionization), it should NOT go in the trash because these contain a small amount of radioactive material. Contact the manufacture for disposal instructions.



## **SMOKE & CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR INSTALLATION PROGRAM**

The Addison Fire Protection District can provide "free" smoke and CO detectors, including installation, to eligible residents. Contact the Addison Fire Prevention Bureau (FPB) for more information at either of the following:
