1. Call to order, roll call

The February 2, 2021 Advisory Liquor Commission meeting was called to order at 3:18 p.m. by Chairman Rick Delawder. Also in attendance were: Commission Members Tony Amato and Carol Cesario; Mayor Rich Veenstra; Village Manager Joe Maranowicz; Police Director Bill Hayden, Deputy Chief Roy Selvik; Attorney David Freeman, Alyssa Cornelius and Mary Heneghan.

Representing Brunch Café was Andy Zatos.

2. Approval of the minutes of the November 10, 2020 meeting

Commission Member Cesario made a motion to recommend acceptance, seconded by Commission Member Amato. Motion approved unanimously.

3. Liquor License Application Public Hearing for BNL Addison Inc. d/b/a Brunch Café at 1407 W. Lake Street, Class "D"

Chairman Delawder read the Public Hearing Notice and Mary Heneghan swore in the applicant.

Chairman Delawder asked Mr. Zatos if he has read the Liquor Code, and he responded that he has gone through it. Mr. Zatos stated that his other locations have alcohol, and that he will mainly be serving mimosas and bloody mary's. The Addison location will be open 7 days a week, from 7am to 2pm (he will send a revised menu with these hours listed).

Detective Chief Selvik reported that the background check came back without any issues. The Basset certificate for Ted Zatos needs to be submitted to the Village. He then explained the Police Department's policies on conducting license / underage drinking checks at the liquor establishments in town twice a year. He stated that the Police Department likes to have good, positive working relationships with all of the liquor establishments and he encouraged Mr. Zatos to call if he ever had any issues or concerns at this location.

Village Manager Maranowicz stated that per Ordinance, they will have 60 days to become operational once the liquor license is granted. Mr. Zatos replied that they anticipated being open in three weeks.

Commission Member Cesario asked what their capacity is, and Mr. Zatos responded that they have approximately 35 tables of 4 along with a small bar area. There are booths along the windows. Commission Member Amato asked how the alcohol would be served, and Mr. Zatos responded that it would be brought to the tables by servers. It would also be available for pick-up orders under the Governor's current Executive Order.

Village Manager Maranowicz asked if there would be video gaming, and Mr. Zatos responded no.

Commission Member Amato made a motion to recommend approval of this liquor license application, seconded by Commission Member Cesario. The motion was approved unanimously.

Village Manager Maranowicz reviewed the next steps of the approval process with the applicant.


