Neighborhood Watch Letter Police Reports by Geographical Area:

North Area (north of Lake Street)

Wilmer A. Lopez-Pu of Addison was charged with driving under the influence. Lopez-Pu was stopped for speeding and improper lane usage and was found to be driving under the influence. Lopez-Pu was additionally cited for operating a vehicle without insurance, disobeying a traffic control signal and illegally using a cell phone while operating a vehicle.

East Area (east of Addison Road)

Ronaldo A. Perez of Addison was charged with driving under the influence. Perez was stopped for improper lane usage, speeding and following too closely. Perez was charged with driving under the influence. He was additionally cited for driving while his license was suspended and unlawful use of cannabis.

West Area (west of Lombard Road)

Osmar F. Funes-Merida of Addison was charged with obstructing identification, no valid driver's license, failure to reduce speed to avoid an accident, driving the wrong way and improper lighting.

Raymond Martinez of Addison was charged with driving under the influence. Officers responded and investigated a traffic accident and later found Martinez to be driving under the influence.

Central Area

Michael J. Niebrzydowski of Wood Dale was charged with attempt retail theft.

Niebrzydowski attempted to take merchandise belonging to Carnecerias Jimenez without paying.

Deborah C. Fonseca of Addison was arrested on a warrant out of the Addison Police Department for driving under the influence, endangering the health or life of a child, driving while license suspended and operating a vehicle without insurance. Fonseca also had a failure to appear warrant out of the DuPage County Sheriff's Office for driving while license revoked.

Alexandra Mota of Harvey was charged with domestic battery. During a verbal argument, Mota threw food at the victim and struck the victim, causing a scratch on the victim's face.

Sergio D. Olguin-Duran of Addison was charged with driving under the influence. While investigating a traffic accident in the area, the subject was observed traveling through the site of that accident investigation, not yielding to emergency vehicles. Upon stopping the vehicle and after further investigation, the subject was charged with driving under the influence of drugs, and possession of cannabis by the driver.

Cassidy L. Lavold of Melrose Park was charged with driving under the influence. Subject was observed slumped over the wheel of the vehicle in the parking lot of 2 W. Lake Street. Subject was later charged with driving under the influence.

Brisleyde Blanco, Huriel Hernandez and Brian Villanueva were charged with armed robbery with a firearm and transported to the DuPage County Jail.

Winter Driving Safety Tips

Make sure your car is ready for winter and the weather it brings.

- Adjust your speed. If the weather is anything but clear and 50 degrees, drive a little slower than normal.
- Increase stopping distance. When driving on slick roads, you need at least three times more distance to stop. Always make sure you have enough space between you and the car in front.
- Give yourself extra time. Trips can take longer during winter weather than other times of the year, so give yourself some extra time to get to your destination.
- Watch out for hazardous sections of roadways. Bridges, overpasses and shaded spots often form ice before other parts of the road.
- Bring your cell phone with you. Keep your phone nearby in case you get in an accident. Do not talk or text while driving.
- Keep your windshield and windows clear. Make sure there is a snow brush or scraper in your car at all times.
- Don't cruise. Using cruise control when driving on a slippery, snowy surface can make it hard to react in time.
- Check your tire tread and pressure. Good tire tread and properly inflated tires are essential to staying in control on slippery roads. Rotate your tires on a regular basis. Keep the correct tire pressure in your tires. Visit your local tire store for assistance.
- Fill up on gas. A fuller gas tank prevents the gas line on your car from freezing. Don't slam on your brakes. In winter weather, sudden braking often leads to skids.
