- Rear of building at 900 Nutter Dr.
- Open 24 hrs/day
- Staff available to unload your car, 7am 4pm M-F
- Accepts: paper, cardboard, #1 and #2 plastics, aluminum.



BLOOMFIELD

- Across the street from City Hall (141 Depot St.)
- Open 24 hrs/day
- Accepts paper and cardboard ONLY.



NEW HAVEN

- Behind the building at 306 Center St.
- Open 24 hrs/day
- Accepts paper and cardboard ONLY.

All proceeds from the sale of recycled materials benefit Nelson County Industries - a workshop for mentally and developmentally handicapped adults.

WHAT TO RECYCLE :

PLASTIC

In Bardstown, we accept #1 and #2 plastics. #1 plastics are generally made of a tinted or seethrough plastic, and #2 plastics are usually household item containers, such as milk jugs, or water, liquid laundry soap, bleach, and shampoo bottles. Bloomfield and New Haven do not accept plastics.



PAPER

Recycle loose-leaf paper or computer paper from your home, as well as entire newspapers. Bardstown, Bloomfield, and New Haven accept mixed paper, glossy inserts, junk mail, and thin cardboard such as breakfast cereal boxes or pasta boxes.



ALUMINUM

CARDBOARD

In Bardstown, we accept aluminum cans such as those from soda or energy drinks. Please rinse cans with water and crush them before recycling. Bloomfield and New Haven do not accept aluminum.



Bardstown, Bloomfield, and New Haven accept corrugated cardboard and thin cardboard from food boxes or other small packaged items. Thin cardboard should be recycled with mixed paper. All cardboard should be clean, free of paint and grease, and flattened.

REDUCE. REUSE. RECYCLE

Before your weekly trip to the local recyclng center, think about the first two tenets of recycling. How can you **REDUCE** the amount of energy and materials that you use on a daily basis? How can you **REUSE** items intead of throwing them away?

Please continue to preserve our natural resources by **RECYCLING** plastic bottles, newspaper, mixed paper, aluminum cans, and cardboard. **TELL YOUR FRIENDS AND FAMILY** about the recycling programs in Bardstown, Bloomfield, and New Haven.

WE CAN NOT ACCEPT:

Tin cans, glass, styrofoam, styrofoam egg cartons, cat food cans, plastic food containers (such as yogurt and margarine), motor oil containers, five-gallon plastic buckets, or plastic toys.
