AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELTON BY CHANGING THE DESCRIBED DISTRICT FROM AGRICULTRUAL DISTRICT TO HEAVY INDUSTRIAL FOR APPROXIMATLY 5.78 ACRES LOCATED ON TAYLORS VALLEY ROAD, EAST OF HUBBARD LANE AND WEST OF THE LEON RIVER.
