MESSAGE FROM THE CITY MANAGER

Happy December to you,

As we close out 2022 and look forward to a new year, I hope you look back over the past 12 months with a sense of pride in all that has happened in our community. I know I do.

The dedicated public servants who serve Berkley notched some fantastic victories in the ongoing effort to keep our city awesome.

This year saw the completion and complete overhaul of our Public Works offices, installed new play equipment and walkway in our parks, partnered with Berkley Schools and the Downtown Development Authority on the ArtSpace plaza, completely rebuilt a half-mile section of Kenmore & Cornwall Ave, raised over \$100,000 for the development of an inclusive playground, and completed our 200th road repair project funded by the 2018 Infrastructure millage.

Impressive on its own, what I am most proud of is the investments in the people who make it all possible. I talk a lot about our team for reason. They work hard, they succeed, and they are the biggest reason why we have seen improvements in our standard of living. We were joined by many new faces this year and we were proud to see other, longstanding members of our team take on new leadership roles as well. A great example of this can be found within our Public Works Department (DPW) where we promoted longtime employees to fill our DPW Director and Assistant DPW Director positions. Along with filling two laborer and one administrative positions. Likewise, in our Public Safety Department, we filled eight officer positions, hired two dispatchers, and proudly applauded the promotion of an officer to the rank of Sergeant. In order to better serve Berkley, our Parks and Recreation Department added an employee and also created a position dedicated to creating new events and improving upon the ones we already know and love. As if all those upgrades were not enough, we also overhauled our Community Development Department with a new director, staff in new roles, and the addition of a new staff member to serve all your building, planning, zoning, and code enforcement needs. Whew!!

Lastly, I hope you read my article in the upcoming winter edition of the Berkey Buzz where I talk about ending the "Good enough for Berkey" mentality which asks us to settle for less because of where we live. As you can see, our team is constantly improving, our City is constantly improving, and we should expect nothing less from our community as we move forward in 2023.

Winter Is Main Break Season

Our yearly average is near 20 main breaks per year. If residents notice a water main break, we ask that they call public works immediately. Please note that the same crews that clear the roads of ice and snow also perform any water main break repairs. There may be additional time needed for repairs during storm events.

Traveling For The Winter?

We encourage residents that plan to be out of town for the winter months to call us and arrange for a seasonal water turn-off in the winter months. This also limits the possibility of pipes freezing.

Sump Pump Discharge Reminder

In the winter months, sump pump discharges can cause hazardous conditions if they are directed to roadways or sidewalks. Please redirect sump pump discharges to grassy areas when possible.

Lead Service Line Replacement Program

Having safe, clean, healthy drinking water is a top priority for the City. That is why we are asking all residents to submit photos of their water service line near the meter for verification. City Sidewalk Program

The City of Berkley continues to replace the sidewalks around the city that are in the worst condition. While paying to replace sidewalks is never a fun proposition, it makes our city safer for everyone and increases the value of our property at the same time.

When it comes time to pay your sidewalk invoice, please note that our City Council has approved giving residents extra time to pay their bills without added interest fees.

The Fall 2022 Sidewalk Replacement Program was completed and invoices will be generated in early 2023. Those bills can be paid at anytime after they are received. If property owners need additional time to pay the sidewalk bills they can allow the payment to be split between the winter 2023 tax bill and the summer 2024 tax bill as a special assessment.

TWELVE HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

- Keep decorations at least three feet away from heat sources - especially those with an open flame, like fireplaces and candles.
- The best decorations are safe decorations, so when you're decorating, make sure not to run cords under rugs or furniture.

Always turn off your decorations when you leave your home and when you're sleeping.





If you're using extension cords or adapters that add receptacles, consider having a qualified electrician add more outlets to your home.



Only use electronics in dry areas. As tempting as it is, you just can't decorate your aquarium with icicle lights.









Remember that phones and tablets should stay on your nightstand.















If you're using a space heater, switch it off before leaving the room.

Inspect your decorations and discard any that are damaged or worn out.







Keep batteries stored safely in their packaging and out of reach from small children and pets.

PREPARE YOUR CAR FOR WINTER

In addition to annual maintenance, here are some tips to winterize your car:

- Test your battery. Battery power drops as the temperature drops.
- Make sure the cooling system is in good working order.
- Have winter tires with a deeper, more flexible tread put on your car.
- If using all-season tires, check the tread on your tires and replace if less than 2/32 of an inch.
- Check your tire pressure. Tire pressure drops as the temperature drops.
- Check your wiper blades and replace if needed.
- Add wiper fluid rated for -30 degrees.
- Keep your gas tank at least half full to avoid a gas line freeze.

Before you head out...

- Clean your car's external camera lenses and side view mirrors so you'll be able to see what's around you.
- Remove dirt, ice, and snow from sensors to allow assistive-driving features like automatic emergency braking to
- In frigid weather, you may want to warm up the car before you drive it.
- To prevent carbon monoxide poisoning, never leave a vehicle running in your garage even with the garage door up.
- If the forecast looks iffy, wait out the storm if possible. If you must travel, share your travel plans and route with someone before you leave.

DON'T CROWD THE PLOW ON THE ROAD

Stay at least 100ft away or 3 cars length away.
