2022 Elections ... #BerkleyVotes

The General Election will take place on **Tuesday**, **November 8**, **2022**. All seven precincts will be open from 7 AM to 8 PM.

Interested in Voting Absentee?

Visit the Clerk's Office today to register to vote or sign up to receive an absentee ballot.

Residents wishing to complete an application to receive an absentee ballot may do so by contacting the Clerk's Office at 248-658-3310 or via email at clerk@berkleymich.net.



NOTE: A lot of changes are happening this year including new voter ID cards and redistricting for our community. Be sure to review your new voter registration and what district you are in.

Want to see a Sample Ballot?

Sample ballots are available in the Clerk's Office and online at www.michigan.gov/vote.

• **NOTE:** The Clerk's Office does not have enough absentee ballots on hand to use as a sample ballot. Once absentee ballots are completed, feel free to drop them in the mail, place them in the City's secure drop box, or bring them to the Clerk's Office at your earliest convenience. Although it is very helpful for the Clerk's Office to receive your absentee ballots before Election Day, voters have until 8 PM on November 8, 2022, to turn them in.




Halloween Safety Tips

It's the SPOOKIEST time of the year! With that, we would like to share with you some helpful HALLOWEEN tips:

- **H**old a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others see you.
- Always test make-up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent possible skin and eye irritation.
- Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.
- Lower your risk for serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses.
- Only walk on sidewalks whenever possible, or on the far edge of the road facing traffic to stay safe.
- Wear well-fitting masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.
- Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating homemade treats made by strangers.
- Enter homes ONLY if you're with a trusted adult. ONLY visit well-lit houses. NEVER accept rides from strangers.
- Never walk near lit candles or luminaries. Be sure to wear flame-resistant costumes.

NOTE: The City does not regulate start/end times for Halloween. However, we see ghouls and goblins out and about around 6 PM. If you do not wish to participate in the festivities, be sure to turn off your outside lights and close your curtains to avoid any confusion.

The Sidewalk Program Continues in Berkley

Property owners having sidewalks replaced in October 2022 will have until the end of September 2023 (9-30-2023) to pay their invoice in full to avoid having the amount rolled onto their winter and summer tax bills.

Paying the invoice in full avoids a special assessment fee that would be added to amounts rolled onto tax bills.

If a property owner chooses to have the sidewalk invoice rolled onto taxes, it will be split in half. So 50% of your bill will go on the winter 2023 tax bill and 50% of the bill will go on the summer 2024 tax bill. Each bill would have a \$20.00 special assessment administrative fee added to the total.



Curbside Leaf Pick Up

Curbside leaf pickup begins this month! Starting in mid-to-late October, leaves can be placed curbside for collection by Public Works staff. Other yard waste items will still need to be placed in a bag or a marked yard waste can for weekly pickup on your trash day. Chipper Service
