CITY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Beulah City Council was called to order at 7:00 pm by Mayor Travis Frey with Council Members Kelsey Timmer, Clyde Schulz, David Czywczynski, David Ripplinger, Gary Miller, Kathy Kelsch, and Loren Daede present. Eric Hoffer absent.

Also Present: City Attorney Scott Solem, City Engineer Charlie Hankins, Economic Director Granville Brinkman, Police Chief Frank Senn, City Auditor Heather Ferebee, and Editor Amy Nash

Pledge of Allegiance.

Kelsch moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting on November 18 and approve as furnished to the Council by email. Miller seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor.

COUNCIL PORTFOLIOS

Council Member Czywczynski

The Snow Route will remain the same for this winter.

Council Member Daede

Daede moved to approve Pay Estimate #2 for \$55,958.23 to American General Contractors, Inc. for the Pump Station #2 Rehabilitation project. Timmer seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor.

Council Member Schulz

Schulz moved to accept the Municipal Court Report for October and November. Czywczynski seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor. Schulz moved to accept the Ordinance 402 permit form and waive the first-year fee for security systems. Daede seconded. Each year after the first year hook up there will be a \$10 fee. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor. Holiday buses are running for West River Transit.

Council Member Timmer

The unexpired term on the Assessment Board that John Phillips took over is up this month. Frey appointed John Phillips to the Assessment Board. Timmer moved to approve the appointment. Schulz seconded. The term will be for six years. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede and Kelsch in favor. Miller opposed. Motion passed.

Council Member Kelsch

Employee Relations met and have recommended the Economic Development job position be changed to a salary position. Kelsch moved to accept the Employee Relations recommendation to change the Economic Development Director pay rate from hourly to salary. Schulz seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor.

CITY PERSONNEL

Police Chief

A system glitch in Odyssey with the DOT has been identified. When someone doesn't pay a citation after fourteen days, the DOT sends them a letter and the license is suspended fourteen days after that. The DOT was only doing that on three violations instead of all of them. The Police Department will send out letters to the ones that were missed. There is close to \$12,000 of unpaid traffic violations out there yet. The Police Department gave away eight turkey dinners this year.

City Auditor

Local Permit for bingo and a 50/50 raffle for Heritage Park Market at the Beulah Civic Center for Shop Small Saturday has been moved to December 7, 2019. Schulz moved to change the date of the local permit. Miller seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor.

Economic Development Director

SBA sent a notice of an available program to businesses in Mercer County that have been impacted by farm and ranch weather conditions. Other available programs were mentioned. The BND loan available for city sidewalks should be extended to March 1. There are five Leo members signed up to learn more about city government.

City Engineer

Invoices were presented for the intersection project at 12th St NW and Frontage Road. Czywczynski moved to pay the M Construction & Landscape invoice for \$50,818.90. Daede seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor. \$49,669.00 will be for the intersection and \$1,149.90 will be billed to homeowners for repairs to a sidewalk.

Czywczynski moved to approve the American Engineering Testing, Inc. invoice for \$1,026.50. Daede seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor.

City Attorney

Intersection Project on 12th St NW & Frontage Road: Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of a \$120,000 Certificate of Indebtedness to evidence the BND loan for 2% interest. Kelsch moved to approve the resolution for the BND loan with a maximum of \$120,000 as presented. Czywczynski

seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor.

Resolution accepting the tax lots offered to the City for \$1 each from Mercer County. A check for \$40 will be sent to the County. The City will hold the title for 90 days after it is received. It will be up to the City to recoup the specials it has lost on the sale of the lots. Schulz moved to approve the resolution accepting the tax lots offered to the City for \$1 each from Mercer County. Kelsch seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor.

The Home Rule Charter will be signed and sent to the Secretary of State's Office. The Sales Tax Ordinance draft is still being worked on and will be provided before the next Council meeting.

Schulz moved to pay the bills as presented. Daede seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Timmer, Daede, Kelsch and Miller in favor.
