



## **Please take immediate notice.**

After reviewing the data from the National weather Service's Advanced Hydrologic Prediction Service Projections, the City of Beulah convened a special meeting for flood water preparedness. The data we received showed the potential for spring flooding beginning 4/9 through 4/12. Being that Beulah does not have historical data for the new bridge, there is still a level of uncertainty as to where the flooding will occur, if it will occur, or how much; however, we do feel that any flooding will be minimal, and limited to the southern edge of the city.

In an overabundance of caution, we are planning for a worst case scenario, yet expecting minimal, if any, flooding. We have ordered approximately 900 tons of sand, 35,000 sandbags, and 1,500 linear feet of sand filled water barrier. We have multiple individuals watching all creek and river water levels from Manning, ND to Hazen.

With this spring thaw event, there is a much higher probability that the southern part of Beulah, along with any homes that are in low lying areas, will have backups into basements, through the sewer system and general basement water infiltration. Please take this seriously, as this is a high probability. Please plan accordingly and prepare your lower areas for the potential of ground water and/or sewer infiltration. Although we believe this will be limited to the southern part of Beulah, we are not certain. If you have sump pumps in your basement, check their operation and make sure you have a backup.
