CITY COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Beulah City Council was called to order at 7:00 pm by Mayor Travis Frey with Council Members Clyde Schulz, David Czywczynski, David Ripplinger, Gary Miller, Eric Hoffer, and Loren Daede present. Kelsey Timmer and Kathy Kelsch absent.

Schulz moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting on December 16 and approve as furnished to the Council by email. Czywczynski seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

Special Event Permit for alcohol for Bronson's Marketplace at the Beulah Energy Wellness Center on January 25, 2020 for the Red, White and Wellness Event. Schulz moved to approve the permit as presented. Daede seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

Council Member Schulz

Schulz moved to accept the Municipal Court Report. Czywczynski seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

Council Member Miller

Attended the Mercer County Planning and Zoning meeting. Council members are encouraged to attend the next meeting. The date will be emailed to council members.

Council Member Hoffer

The garbage route of 10th Street NE will change. It is a dead-end street and all garbage carts will be placed on one side of the street so the truck only needs to back down it once. The Minot recycling business will no longer accept recycling. We will need to look into other areas to find out if we can continue to accept recycling.

Council Member Czywczynski

Czywczynski moved to approve the appointments. Schulz seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

Council Member Daede

Change Order #1 for \$3,174 to American General Contractors, Inc. for the Pump Station #2 Rehabilitation project. The gate valve was not in the initial bid, but the Health Department suggested it. Daede moved to approve Change Order #1. Hoffer seconded. It was discussed that the valve is an extra safety precaution if they would have to pull the pumps. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

Daede moved to approve Pay Estimate #3 for \$61,930.60 to American General Contractors, Inc. for the Pump Station #2 Rehabilitation project. Miller seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

A water break on Sunny Drive is being repaired. There is some damage in the RV Park from the break.

Mayor Frey

JDA reorganized in December. Nathan Richter as president, Travis Frey as Vice, Beaver Brinkman as Secretary, and Michael Woods as Treasurer. Frey appointed Gloria Olheiser, Scott Solem, Beaver Brinkman, and Mary Lou Horning to JDA for another three years each. Schulz moved to approve the appointments. Daede seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

Kathy Kelsch, Beaver Brinkman and Russell Duppong are placed on a committee for the sale of the lots that came back to the City. They will discuss and come back to Council with a recommendation on how to proceed with selling the lots.

Schulz moved to approve the three local permits as presented. Miller seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

Economic Development Director

A letter will be sent to the Mercer County Commissioners stating the City of Beulah expresses support for the sand mine near Stanton. This would benefit our community. It would bring twenty jobs to our County for thirty years. Miller moved to approve sending the letter to the Mercer County Commissioners in support of sand mining. Czywczynski seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

A Request for Proposal Letter was sent to the ND Dept of Commerce in regards to a plastic recycling plant to possibly be located next to DGC. The site has the resources needed. They will do a site visit in January if it is accepted.

A Beulah City Art Contest was presented. It will provide interaction between our city, school and others in the community. First prize of \$200 and second prize of \$100 in each category. The art would be displayed in the council room.

Businesses on Main Street will be asked to attend a meeting to discuss their interest in participating in a sidewalk, tree and light project. The BND loan is still available and could be used for the Main Street sidewalks as a special improvement district. The Pfennig Wildlife Museum has a really good collection and it is important that it remains in Beulah. There will be a Vision West meeting on January 16 at 10:00 am.

City Engineer

2020 Street Maintenance Repairs will start to be looked at with bids going out this spring.

City Coordinator

County Road SE signage should be changed to East County Road. Hoffer moved to change the street sign as presented. Miller seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor. P&Z will meet January 16 at 5:00 pm. P&Z would like to decrease to one meeting per month. Some LOMR information was sent to us, but it is generic. A meeting will be held in Zap on January 9 to discuss the LOMR. The storm shelter paperwork is being followed up on. One bid was received on the tree grant.

City Attorney

Second Reading of Ordinance 430 on Sales Tax. Schulz moved to have second reading on Sales Tax Ordinance No. 430. Daede seconded. Roll call vote found Ripplinger, Czywczynski, Schulz, Daede, Hoffer and Miller in favor.

Police Chief

Statistics were given for the year for the police department. Calls for service increased in 2019 from 2018.
