### January 11<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting Report

January 8, 2021

- Meetings that I have been or will be attending:
  - Jan 11<sup>th</sup> County COVID Cooperative Meeting
  - Jan 12<sup>th</sup> Infrastructure & Housing Development Task Force
  - Jan 13<sup>th</sup> Federal Reserve Regional Economic Conditions Conference
- Permits
  - Permit applications are still coming in along with questions on zoning and site standards for 2021 building projects.
- Personnel:
  - DPW is back to being fully staffed. Note the training request included in this week's packet.
  - Nine of our Firefighters received the COVID vaccination on Friday January 8<sup>th</sup>. The original schedule was for some time after the 11<sup>th</sup>. Police and Fire departments were scheduled to be completed by the 15<sup>th</sup>, when the Health Department will be moving on to the next group on the priority list.
- Legislation:
  - Public Act 254 of 2020 extends the ability to hold electronic meetings through March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021, with provisions to allow for local governing body or chief administrative officer to declare emergency conditions to allow electronic meetings through December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2021.
  - Public Act 252 of 2020 restricts municipalities from shutting off water service for nonpayment until 2022.
- Michigan Recreation Grant applications will not be available for review or application until February. I would like to meet with the Parks and Rec Committee this month to explore a couple options to apply for.
- A rebuilt transmission was ordered to be installed for our sander (Ford F-450) \$3,101.58. The truck has low miles, is solid, and we have an immediate need for it.
- Coleman engineering is hosting our GIS with new software and providing the service under a trial basis while municipalities explore working with the County to host the server which would save money and provide more ease of use.
