PAYMENT OPTIONS

When paying your utility or tax bill, we have a few options for you to take advantage of:

1. In-person. Our office is open 7:30am-4:00pm, Monday through Friday.
2. 24-hour drop box. Can't make it in during normal business hours? We have a secure drop box located next to our front door that you can drop your payment into anytime.
3. Online. BS&A, our billing software company, provides our residents with the ability to pay their tax and utility bills online. You can find that option by going to our website, www.breitungtp.org, and clicking on the "Utility/Tax Information" link on the main page. You will have to create a login if you haven't already and the website will walk you through the process from there.
4. Over the phone. If you're wanting to pay with your debit or credit card, you can call the Utility Clerk or our Treasurer and we can take payments over the phone.
5. Mail. You can mail in your payment to:

6. ACH withdrawal. We offer FREE automatic withdrawal from either your checking or a savings account on the day your bill is due.

**When paying with a debit or credit card, please keep in mind the 3%, minimum of \$2, convenience fee that our third-party provider charges.*

REMINDER: Whether mailing or dropping off a bill payment, it **MUST** be received in our office by the due date in order to avoid the late penalty.

Upcoming Election Information:

August 7, 2018 Primary Election is an election held to narrow the field of candidates for the positions to be voted on in the November Gubernatorial Election, an opportunity for Precinct Delegates to be elected to their respective parties, and to vote on the four county millage renewals. One important thing to remember when voting in a Primary, you must choose one party to vote for and then continue to vote for candidates in that party. According to Michigan Election Law, you cannot cross over vote. If you do, your ballot will be returned by the machine and you will need to revote a new ballot or override the error.

November 6, 2018 General Election will allow voters to elect a Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, U.S. Senator, U.S. Representative, State Representative, State Senator, Dickinson County Commissioner as well as a Township Trustee.

Having the opportunity to vote is a privilege as well as a responsibility we should not take lightly. Ralph Waldo Emerson said, "Those who stay away from the election think that one vote will do no good. 'Tis but one step more to think one vote will do no harm."

You are welcome to bring your compost and yard waste to the county compost site (the baler facility behind the Tri-City Cinemas in Quinnesec) for no charge. Compost is picked up street-side every first Monday of the month from May until November.
