A Note from our Fire Chief

Breitung Township Residents,

I would like to take the opportunity to thank everyone for the support we have received. As Paid on Call Fire Fighters, we are members of the community and have a desire to help our community grow and prosper. You will see us promoting programs that support our friends and neighbors, such as representing the Township in the 4th of July Parade, hosting activities at Halloween, presenting Fire Safety Programs in the Schools, supporting programs for the Lake Antoine Park Partners and the Dickinson County Library, and many others.

We are ready to respond in the Township and the local area to help in emergency situations ranging from fires, vehicle accidents, storm aftermath, medical emergencies, and more. In order for us to be better able to respond when an emergency arises there are a couple of things we need help with.

1.) When called, time is often a critical factor. Please make sure your Fire Number or House Number is in a location that is easy to see and in good condition. At times it is difficult to identify the correct address.

2.) Our vehicles are large and not as maneuverable as your personal vehicles. We need access that is about 12 feet wide and 12 feet high, the driving surface must be a minimum of 10 feet wide with no sharp turns, and capable of supporting vehicle weighing 40,000 lbs. This also applies to any bridges you have on the vehicle access to your property. Not having this access could severely limit our ability to respond in an effective manner.

From the Desk of Township Superintendent Steve Mulka

The Township has had another busy year. Availability of materials has delayed some projects and going forward the Township has adopted procedures to stockpile materials for projects up to two years out, so they are shovel ready when bids are let, streamlining the process for the contractor, reducing delays, and stabilizing costs.

At the Quinnesec Park we are installing a pickleball court and resurfacing the tennis court for dual use with additional recreation improvements in the planning stage. Breitung Township Schools are providing free lunches at the Quinnesec Park to anyone under 18, Monday through Friday 11:15-12:45.

We have again been awarded a grant for Scrap Tire Cleanup and will start accepting tires at reduced

cost once details are finalized.

The Planning Commission is in the process of updating the Township's Master Plan. This guides development by identifying issues and goals for our long-term planning. There is a public input session scheduled **August 11th at 6:00pm** in our Boardroom for residents to provide input on what they would like those goals and projects to be.

The Township has a new (used) Fire Rescue Truck now in service, and a New Tanker-Pumper to be delivered around the end of this year. We have also upgraded safety equipment with the purchase of new Air Packs and Turnout Gear for our Firefighters.

As a reminder we do have a Drive up Drop Box for township correspondence and bill payments near the Main Boardroom Entrance in the South parking lot.

Treasurer's Two Cents



It's that time of year again so I thought it would be good to remind everyone that in addition to cash, checks, and direct debits, we accept online payments and credit cards in our office or over the phone for

tax payments. There is a 3% convenience fee from our third-party provider for all CC payments. Please remember payments must be received in our office before or on the due date to avoid additional fees.

A township property owner of eligible property may file a completed summer property tax deferment form in our office before September 15. A valid deferment permits summer property taxes to be paid on or before February 15 without any additional penalty and interest. Taxpayers may defer their summer property tax if they meet the following criteria. Payment may be deferred until February 15 for principal residence property owned by a taxpayer who:

- Has a total gross household income of \$40,000 or less for the preceding tax year, and
- Is totally and permanently disabled, blind, parapleqic, hemiplegic, quadriplegic, or
- Is an eligible serviceperson, eligible veteran, or eligible widow or widower, or
- Is at least age 62

If you received a deferment in 2021, a new application will be sent to you. If you do not receive an application by the end of July, or you believe you are newly eliqible this year, please contact our office.
