
Welcome Mike Gillett!

AUTOMATIC BILL PAY NOW AVAILABLE FOR THE 2018 WINTER TAX PAYMENTS

Starting with the 2018 winter tax bill, taxpayers can now have their tax bills automatically deducted from either their checking or savings account. This service is free to use. The sign-up form can be picked up in the office, or downloaded off of our website. This program works the same as our utility automatic bill pay with the exception that a new form must be filled out each tax year. In the office we accept cash, checks, and all major debit and credit cards. Online, we accept debit or credit cards or e-checks. Please remember that using any debit; or credit cards, whether over the phone, online, or in our office, will add a 3% convenience fee from our third party provider who processes our payments. 
