Thermostats

Please be reminded that the thermostats will not go above 72°. If you force the thermostat past 72° it will break, and you will be charged accordingly. Please provide a Dr. statement if you need an exception.

Reporting Income Changes

Please remember that the lease states that you must promptly report income changes to Management within ten (10) days of occurrence.

Ice Melt

The ice melt we have in the office is now free of charge. Please bring your own container when picking up ice melt and remember to secure the lid on the ice melt container.

Free Ice Melt Locations:

- For South Parkview Buildings 10-31: At office entry and under canopy by 19 Building.
- For Family in Buildings 1-8: Top of steps between 4 & 7 Buildings
- For Family in Buildings 115-117: By mailboxes
- For North Parkview Buildings 110-114: In circle drive beside out-going mail box.
- For North Parkview Buildings 101-109: Under canopy between 101 & 102 Buildings.
- For Evergreen 118-135 Buildings: By mailboxes near 119 & 132 Buildings.

SPACE HEATER CHARGE - North Parkview Senior Section - Residents in 101A - 114D

Reminder: All residents living in 101A thru 114D <u>ONLY</u> will be charged \$15.00 per month for excess electric usage for using a space heater. Space heaters must be UL approved (Underwriters Laboratory Safety Compliance - UL LISTED) and be approved by the Big Rapids Housing Commission.

Garbage Disposal

We have observed that tenants have been laying their garbage on top of and beside the dumpsters instead of placing it inside the dumpster which is causing it to fall on the ground. Please discontinue this practice.

High Rise Recycle Area

The recycling area is not the place to dispose of your bagged garbage. Help keep this area tidy and odor free by rinsing out your containers and placing them in the proper bins.

Laundry Room Reminders

Remember when doing your laundry to always clean out your pockets prior to washing your clothing, clean washers after use and empty dryer lint traps after each use. Also, a reminder of laundry room hours are as follows:

South Parkview Village Laundry Room Hours:

Monday – Friday 7:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Saturdays/Sundays 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

North Parkview Village Laundry Room Hours:

Monday – Saturdays 7:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Sunday 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Evergreen Village Laundry Room Hours:

Monday – Friday 7:30 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. Saturdays/Sundays 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The doors will be locked at closing time – so make sure you are done with your laundry according to the closing times.

For the protection of our residents we have security cameras throughout the Big Rapids Housing Commission complexes.

Snow Removal Reminders

Do Not Pull Your Vehicle Over the Sidewalks!!!

Be prepared to move or have someone move your vehicle on snow days so all parking areas may be plowed properly. Residents shall be responsible to remove snow and ice from the immediate unit area, patios, porches and service walks to main sidewalk.

Please contact the office if you observe any icy sidewalks or lots that need attention. Ice melt is available for FREE in the office and the other locations listed above, you must bring your own container.

Many of you are not moving your vehicles for snow removal. In most cases, it is necessary for ALL vehicles to move from the lot. Be considerate to others in your area who make the effort to move.

Please be on the lookout for our snow removal trucks and tractors! Keep a safe distance from this equipment. The maintenance staff is concerned for your safety, as many people walk out in front of and behind them. With all the attached equipment on their vehicles, it makes it very difficult for them to see a pedestrian behind their vehicle – especially children.

Do you have moisture in your home?

Moisture issues can become a major concern for everyone. There are many reasons why moisture can be a problem, which is why controlling moisture is key. Please review the following "moisture control tips":

- When water leaks or spills occur indoors, ACT QUICKLY and clean up wet or damp areas immediately.
- If you see condensation or moisture collecting on windows, walls or pipes ACT QUICKLY to dry the wet surface and reduce the moisture/water source. Condensation can be a sign of high humidity.
- Run the bathroom fan if you have one when showering and run it for 20-30 minutes after showering.
- Use the range hood exhaust fan whenever cooking.
- Do not block heat registers and vents as this may restrict proper air flow in your unit.

Maintenance Treatment for Bed Bugs

The Housing Commission has renewed the contract with Rose Pest Solutions to inspect all apartments for bed bugs, inspect and/or install monitors on all the accessible beds and couches, and spray the door jambs and doorways throughout the apartments. Residents will receive an additional notification. This is the tentative schedule for this month:

Residents with allergies will have an opportunity before the treatment date to notify the office if anyone residing in the apartment has asthma/respiratory ailments or sensitivity to petrochemicals. Do not call now.

You are required to contact the office immediately or within 24 hours if you suspect you see a bed bug or other vermin in your apartment.

It will be necessary for you to acquire a bed frame so the monitors can be installed. These monitors must be kept in place at all times and the resident will be charged \$5.00 per monitor for any damaged or removed monitors.

Reminder!

Wipes are not flushable! Even if the package claims they are sewer safe and flushable, they <u>ARE NOT</u> and this eventually leads to clogged sewer lines. A charge will apply if personal wipes are found to be the cause of your sewer back up.

Maintenance Reminders to All Residents

- If you are aware of an emergency work order, such as having no heat, or toilet not flushing call during hours of operation, if possible! Please do NOT wait until the end of the day to report an issue you were aware of earlier in the day!
- Also, do not dump grease down your sinks. Pour hot grease in a tin container, and when it has cooled then throw it away in the trash. Grease will clog the lines and a charge will apply if grease is found to be the cause of your clogged sink.
