





Attached is a consultation list of tribes with traditional lands or cultural places located within the boundaries of the above referenced counties. Please note that the intent of the referenced codes is to avoid and or mitigate impacts to tribal cultural resources, as defined, in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

As of July 1, 2015, Public Resources Code Sections 21080.1, 21080.3.1 and 21080.3.2 require public agencies to consult with California Native American tribes identified by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) for the purpose of avoiding or mitigating impacts to tribal cultural resources:

Within 14 days of determining that an application for a project is complete or a decision by a public agency to undertake a project, the lead agency shall provide formal notification to the designated contact of, or a tribal representative of, traditionally and culturally affiliated California Native American tribes that have requested notice, which shall be accomplished by means of at least one written notification that includes a brief description of the proposed project and its location, the lead agency contact information, and a notification that the California Native American tribe has 30 days to request consultation pursuant to this section. (Public Resources Code Section 21080.1(d))

The law does not preclude initiating consultation with the tribes that are culturally and traditionally affiliated within your jurisdiction. The NAHC believes that this is the best practice to ensure that tribes are consulted commensurate with the intent of the law.

In accordance with Public Resources Code Section 21080.1(d), formal notification must include a brief description of the proposed project and its location, the lead agency contact information, and a notification that the California Native American tribe has 30 days to request consultation. The NAHC also believes that agencies should also include with their notification letters, information regarding any cultural resources assessment that has been completed on the Area of Potential Effect (APE), such as:

- 1. The results of any record search that may have been conducted at an Information Center of the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS), including, but not limited to:
  - A listing of any and all known cultural resources that have already been recorded or are adjacent to the APE, such as known archaeological sites;
  - Copies of any and all cultural resource records and study reports that may have been provided by the Information Center as part of the records search response;
  - Whether the records search indicates a low, moderate, or high probability that unrecorded cultural resources are located in the APE; and

- If a survey is recommended by the Information Center to determine whether previously unrecorded cultural resources are present.
- 2. The results of any archaeological inventory survey that was conducted, including:
  - Any report that may contain site forms, site significance, and suggested mitigation measures.

All information regarding site locations, Native American human remains, and associated funerary objects should be in a separate confidential addendum, and not be made available for public disclosure in accordance with Government Code Section 6254.10.

- 3. The results of the Sacred Lands File (SLF) check conducted through the Native American Heritage Commission with the USGS topographical information provided had negative results.
- 4. Any ethnographic studies conducted for any area including all or part of the potential APE; and
- 5. Any geotechnical reports regarding all or part of the potential APE.

Lead agencies should be aware that records maintained by the NAHC and CHRIS are not exhaustive. A negative response to these searches does not preclude the existence of a cultural place. A tribe may be the only source of information regarding the existence of a tribal cultural resource.

This information will aid tribes in determining whether to request formal consultation. In the case that they do, having the information beforehand will help to facilitate the consultation process.

If you receive notification of change of addresses and phone numbers from tribes, please notify me. With your assistance, we are able to assure that our consultation list remains current.















As per your request, I have performed a records search on the University of California Museum of Paleontology (UCMP) database for the Burlingame Apartments project on the vehicle tow and storage lot between 609 & 621 California Drive in Burlingame. The project site is located in T4S, R4W, San Mateo quadrangle (2015 USGS 7.5-series topographic map). The surface of the entire site has been disturbed by the emplacement of a parking lot between adjacent structures.

# Geologic Units

According to the part of geologic map of Brabb et al. (1998) shown here, the surface of the area of the project site (tiny red rectangle at center) consists solely of Holocene basin deposits (Qhb), which are too young to be fossiliferous. That deposit overlies the Pleistocene alluvium (Qpaf) that is also surfice-mapped within the half-mile search perimeter (dashed red circle).



# **UCMP** Records Search

I performed a records search on the University of California Museum of Paleontology that focused on Pleistocene vertebrates from San Mateo County. The results are 13 localities that yielded 45 specimens including *Bison latifrons* (long-horned bison), *Mammuthus columbi* (Columbian mammoth), *Camelops hesternus* (Yesterday's camel), *Uria aalge* (common murre), *Glossotherium harlani* (Harlan's ground sloth), *Equus* (horse), and *Enhydra* (sea otter). None of the 13 lo-

calities, however, are within or near the half-mile search radius and the one closest to the project site is 4 miles to the northwest. Thus, the Burlingame site appears to have a low potential but high sensitivity for significant paleontological resources.

# Remarks and Recommendations

Neither a paleontological walkover survey of the site prior to construction or paleontological monitoring during earth-disturbing activities are warranted due to (1) its disturbance by prior development, (2) the absence of any potentially fossiliferous sedimentary deposits on or adjacent to the project site, and (3) the probabilty that the Pleistocene layer is too deeply buried to be impacted by project-related excavations. Nevertheless, construction crew should be apprised that Pleistocene vertebrate fossils, including large mammals, have been found elsewhere in the County and the unlikely disturbance of the Pleistocene layer could reveal significant paleontological resources such as bones and teeth. Should such fossils be unearthed, all construction activities are to be diverted from the find until a professional paleontologist has inspected the discovery and, if deemed significant, salvaged it for deposition in an appropriate repository such as the UCMP for the benefit of scientific education and research.
