Subject: Adoption of a Resolution Declaring the Results of the Municipal Election Held on November 8, 2022

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution declaring the results of the Municipal Election held on November 8, 2022.

BACKGROUND

The City of Burlingame held a General Municipal Election and its first district election on November 8, 2022, for District 1, District 3, and District 5 (four-year terms each). Additionally, the City Council placed Measure X on the ballot.

The Board of Supervisors of San Mateo County was duly requested and did consent to a consolidated election pursuant to the Elections Code. Furthermore, the County Clerk was duly requested to hold the election; notice of the election was duly and regularly given as required by law; voting precincts were duly established; election officers were appointed; and voting supplies were furnished. In every respect and manner, the election was held and conducted, and the votes cast were received within the time and manner prescribed by the law of the State of California controlling elections in general law cities.

DISCUSSION

The City Council should declare the final results of the election by resolution.

The final vote for City Council, as of December 8, 2022, the date the County Elections Office certified the Statewide General Election is:

District 1

- Ricardo Ortiz – 1,531

District 3

- Michael Brownrigg – 2,003

District 5

- Peter Stevenson – 1,271
- Rachel Cyr – 657

Therefore, Ricardo Ortiz is elected to serve a four-year term as District 1's first Councilmember, Michael Brownrigg is elected to serve a four-year term as District 3's first Councilmember, and Peter Stevenson is elected to serve a four-year term as District 5's first Councilmember.

Measure X

The final vote for Measure X as of December 8, 2022, is:

- YES: 8,467
- NO: 2,816

Therefore, with 75.04% of the vote, Measure X was approved by the voters.
