## City Commission Openings on the Beautification and Parks & Recreation Commissions

Are you interested in finding a way to participate in your community? Then consider applying for appointment to one of the City's Commissions! The City invites applicants to offer their interest, experience, and enthusiasm in service of Burlingame! Commission members offer their ideas and recommendations to the City Council and City staff in order to help them make the most informed decisions.

At this time, the City is seeking to fill three seats on the Beautification Commission, all for three-year terms. The City is also seeking to fill three seats on the Parks and Recreation Commission. Two of the seats will be for three-year terms, while one seat will be for a two-year term as one Commissioner is stepping down with two years remaining on her term. Incumbents may reapply. **The application deadline for both is Friday, September 3, 2021.**

## New Water Waste Restrictions

The City has a new Wasteful Water Use Restrictions ordinance that targets and prohibits wasteful water use actions.

The following uses of potable water are prohibited at all times:

- Use of a hose without a positive shut-off nozzle.
- Use of water for cleaning, filling, or operating non-recirculating, decorative water fountains.
- Use of water to irrigate outdoor plants, grass, or landscaping during and within 24 hours of rainfall.
- Use of broken or defective plumbing, sprinkler, watering, or irrigation systems.
- For hotels and motels, provide guests with the option of choosing not to have towels and linens laundered daily.

# PARKING LOT E CLOSURE NOTIFICATION



**Parking Lot E will be closed to make way for the new Town Square & Mixed Use Development at the former Post Office.**

**POST OFFICE PROJECT – 220 PARK ROAD**

- Redevelopment & restoration of portions of former Post Office
- New office development with ground floor retail
- 280 below-grade parking spaces (public use evenings & weekends)
- Includes removal of magnolia street trees along Lorton Avenue and Primrose Road

**Town Square Project – Parking Lot E**

- The City of Burlingame will be developing a town square/community open space on Lot E, envisioned to be the heart of Downtown

**Construction Expected to Start Mid-August /Early September 2021**

The new City of Burlingame Parking Structure at 161 Highland Avenue (just south of Howard) will provide 366 parking spaces – please visit [www.burlingame.org/downtownconstruction](http://www.burlingame.org/downtownconstruction) for more information and updates.



## Upcoming Parking Lot Closure

Lot E, off Park Road near Burlingame Avenue, will be closing soon to make way for the new town square and mixed use development at the former post office location at 220 Park Road. Construction is expected to begin mid-August. A new City parking structure just south of Howard will be opening late summer and will provide 366 parking spaces.

## California Drive Bicycle Facility Project

Please join us at the Thursday, August 12<sup>th</sup> Traffic, Safety and Parking Commission regular meeting, where City staff will present an update on the California Drive Bicycle Facility Project. Visit the [Traffic, Safety & Parking Commission Meeting](#) webpage for meeting details.

The California Drive Bicycle Facility project will focus on improving the existing bicycle network south of Broadway to Oak Grove Avenue. The project includes approximately

0.75 miles of Class II or better bike facility to enhance bike connectivity across the city while improving the safety, comfort, and attractiveness of bicycling for people of varying ages and abilities.
