## Parks Team Greening Up in More Ways Than One

The City's Parks team continually explores more sustainable options for maintaining the City's parks and playing fields. For example, they use an electric mower, installed hydration stations across city parks, use smart irrigation systems, and plant numerous trees a year. They also divert tons of tree waste from the landfill by turning it into mulch that is used throughout the city.

When artificial turf was installed in Murray Field they intentionally chose a turf that avoided the use of crumb rubber - the tiny rubber pellets that can get into waterways and contribute to pollution. Instead, the Parks team opted to use cork and sand - natural substances that don't harm waterways - in the artificial turf.


