On Tuesday, August 3, neighborhoods throughout Burlingame are invited to join forces with thousands of other communities nationwide for the National Night Out crime prevention event. National Night Out is sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch and is co-sponsored locally by the Burlingame Police Department. Over 15,000 communities from all 50 states are expected to participate in this year's "America's Night Out Against Crime".

From 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., people in neighborhoods throughout Burlingame are asked to turn on their outside lights and spend the evening outdoors with neighbors. Many neighborhoods will be hosting a variety of special events such as block parties and cookouts.



Mobile Vaccine Cards now available!

California has launched a digital vaccine card that allows residents who have received their COVID-19 vaccines to have a virtual backup of their physical card.

To obtain the digital copy of your vaccine card, go to myvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov and enter your name, date of birth, and contact information associated with your vaccination. You then have to create a PIN to access the online card. It will have all of the information contained on your physical vaccine card.

If you take a screenshot of this digital card and save it to your phone, you'll always have proof of your vaccination when you are on the go!



Know Your Zone

In order to better inform and alert our community about fires, floods, earthquakes, and other emergencies, the County has purchased an online tool called <u>Zonehaven</u>. Zonehaven is an online map that divides the County into 300 zones.

In an emergency, first responders will issue evacuation or other orders and advisories based on the zones. This information will be pushed out via the news media, social media, emergency alert notifications, and other platforms. Additionally, the Zonehaven platform will be updated with the location of emergency shelters and other vital information to better assist our community.

To log into <u>Zonehaven</u>, enter your address, and find out what zone you live in. Then subscribe to <u>SMC Alerts</u> so that you can receive alerts on your phone and via email about emergencies in your zone.

Why Do I Need a New PG&E Plan?

On August 18, Pacific Gas & Electric (PG&E) is asking its customers to consider moving to a time-of-use rate plan. If they don't make a decision, they will be automatically enrolled in the time-of-use Peak Pricing Plan that increases the cost of energy between 4:00 p.m., and 9:00 p.m. every day.

To find out what's involved, the Citizens Environmental Council will host a Zoom meeting on Tuesday, July 27, from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Peninsula Clean Energy's Director of Account Services Leslie Brown will explain who is eligible for the transition, the bill guarantee for the first year after transitioning, and what your options are if you don't want to switch to a time-of-use rate plan.

PCE and PG&E are charged with moving about 200,000 residential electric customers currently on a tiered rate plan to a time-of-use rate plan in September.

This move is due to a statewide policy that's been in the works for almost a decade to help create cleaner energy. PCE will still use the same rate plans for electricity generation as PG&E at a 5 percent saving over PG&E's rates. 
