## Tips for Keeping Your Home Cool While Saving Energy

PRE-COOL YOUR HOME. Use air conditioners more during morning hours. Then set the thermostat to 78 degrees when at home during the rest of the day, health permitting.

**AVOID USING THE OVEN.** Instead, cook on the stove, use a microwave or grill outside.

LIMIT THE OPENING OF REFRIGERATORS, which are major users of electricity in most homes. The average refrigerator is opened 33 times a day.

USE A CEILING FAN. Turn on a ceiling fan when using the air conditioner, which will allow the thermostat to be raised about 4 degrees to save on cooling costs with no reduction in comfort.

CLEAN CLOTHES AND DISHES EARLY. Use large energy-consuming appliances earlier in the day or late at night after 9 pm.

## **Storm Drain Citizen's Oversight Committee Vacancy**

The City of Burlingame is accepting applications for **one** vacancy on the Storm Drain Citizen's Oversight Committee.

This important role, which ensures that funds collected from storm drain fees are spent only on the storm drainage program, is mandated by the voters who approved the storm drain fee ballot measure to upgrade the storm drainage system to alleviate chronic flooding and protect public health and safety in May 2009.

The Storm Drain Citizen's Oversight Committee consists of three members and generally **meets once a year**. To apply, please complete the application and supplemental questionnaire, which can be found <u>here</u>.

Developed collaboratively with the community and formalized in the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan, the California Drive Bicycle Facility Project will further the City's commitment and efforts to address our community's needs by improving the existing bicycle network from south of Broadway to Oak Grove Avenue.

# Need help paying your utilities? The CA COVID-19 Rent Relief program may be

able to help.

Utility payment assistance is available from the State of California for income eligible renters who have been impacted by COVID-19 and need help paying past due or future utility bills.

### How does it work?

Unpaid utilities dating back to April 1, 2020 will be compensated at 100% of cost, limited to a total of 12 months, and paid directly to the utility provider. Eligible renters may also receive assistance with future payments.

## Who can apply?

Income eligible renters who have experienced a loss of income due to COVID-19 and need help with unpaid or future utility payments.

Assistance from the CA COVID-19 Rent Relief program does not count as earned income and will not affect eligibility for any other state benefit assistance programs.

All applicant information is kept private and will not be shared.

Income eligible applicants may qualify regardless of immigration status and will not be required to show proof of citizenship.

The County of San Mateo, in partnership with the San Mateo County Event Center and the San Mateo County Economic Development Association (SAMCEDA), will be distributing PPE to disadvantaged small business/non-profit organizations for the purpose of preparation and readiness for safe opening in accordance with California's Blueprint for a Safer Economy.

- Each business is invited to request a 30-day supply of PPE available in the County's supply
- PPE will be distributed starting June 17th at the San Mateo County Event Center through the online pre-ordering system for those industries listed below

(Priority will be given to businesses located in disadvantaged communities and small businesses with high-touch interactions with the public)


Please continue to follow these important tips for shopping the Fresh Market:

- Wear face coverings. Vendors will not be selling to anyone without a mask, and you will be asked to leave the market if you are not wearing one.
- · Wash hands/ refrain from touching your face.

- Do not self-serve and retrieve sample direct from a farmer.
- Regulate your own social spacing of 6 feet.
- Wash all produce before consumption.
