


## **Never Miss a City Event or Meeting!**

# Thank You Storm Drain Adopters!

The City would like to send a big "THANK YOU" to our storm drain adopters who have collectively adopted 156 drains throughout Burlingame! Storm drain adopters provide an invaluable service to all of us by removing litter and leaves on and around storm drains and preventing stormwater pollution.

With the recent rains and seasons changing, a lot more leaves are piling up on the ground. Even though the City's Public Works Department <a href="mailto:sweeps the streets on a weekly basis">sweeps the streets on a weekly basis</a> October through March, it's often difficult to collect every piece of debris around storm drains.

If you are interested in volunteering to keep our city clean, check out our <u>Adopt a Drain program</u>. This program enables anyone who lives, works, or spends time in Burlingame to adopt one of storm drains by pledging to keep it free of litter and leaves. ## Have a Zero Waste Thanksgiving

Make your Thanksgiving extra meaningful this year by limiting waste. Here are some ideas to try out:

- Compost all food scraps, napkins, and other paper foodware in the green compost bin
- Avoid plastic one-use items in your home decorations and instead decorate with fall leaves, pumpkins and gourds, and other natural items that can then be composted like <u>this simple fall leaf garland</u>.
- Recycle aluminum foil including trays and liners in the blue recycling bin.
- Choose reusable foodware and serving dishes instead of disposable one-use items.
- Enjoy the leftovers by storing them in reusable containers instead of plastic wrap and plastic storage bags.




# "Puffs": Presented by Burlingame High School Drama Tickets Still Available for This Weekend!
