Seeking Applicants for Measure I Citizens' Oversight Committee

In November 2018, Burlingame voters approved Measure I, a retail transactions and use tax of ¼ percent, which effectively increased the sales tax rate in Burlingame from 9.25 percent to 9.50 percent. (The current rate is 9.625% as a result of the passage last year of a regional Caltrain measure.)

In addition to requiring a separate external audit of the collections and expenditures of the new transactions tax, the measure also provided for the establishment of a Citizens' Oversight Committee, appointed by the City Council to review and report on the receipt of revenue and expenditure of funds from the Measure I tax. Members of the Committee must be residents of the City or representatives of Burlingame businesses.

The City is seeking to fill one vacant seat on the Measure I Citizens' Oversight Committee due to the resignation of one Committee member who moved out of Burlingame. The **application deadline is 5:00 p.m. on Friday, December 3, 2021**. <u>Click here for the</u> <u>application and supplemental questionnaire</u>. 
Thursday Fresh Markets will return May 2021.

- Wash all produce before consumption.



The San Mateo County Board of Supervisors recently approved a <u>second round of grants</u> for <u>San Mateo County Strong's Small Business Grant Program</u>. This program provides funding for small businesses **that have not received any assistance from the County, State, or federal COVID-19 relief programs in the past 12 months**.

The project owners may also have additional eligibility criteria, such as lower income limits for certain units and resident suitability screening such as rental history and credit.

All completed applications submitted through <u>www.mysmchousing.com</u> on or before 11/30/2021 at 5:00 PM will be placed on the waitlist. Positions on the waitlist will be randomly placed by lottery.

*Subsidy Standard: HACSM will place applicants to specific unit size on the waiting list based on the following standard:

- · Head of household and his/her spouse, co-head, or partner will be assigned one bedroom.
- All remaining family members will be assigned one bedroom per two family members regardless
 of gender, age, or relationship of these family members.


