## Temporary Closure: October 14 - 18 Western Trail of Sanchez Lagoon & Ped Access on Anza Bridge

The [Burlingame Muddy Mile Race](#) is back! This Sunday, October 17, from 8:00 a.m. to noon, Burlingame youth will run the course along the Sanchez Lagoon at Bayside and Murray fields. To accommodate this event, the western trail of the Sanchez Lagoon and pedestrian access on the Anza Bridge **will be closed to the public beginning today** through Monday, October 18. In addition, **access will be limited on the eastern trail of Sanchez Lagoon** during the event. We appreciate your understanding as we work to ensure a safe and fun outdoor event for our youth.



## The Parks & Recreation Department Seeks Your Input Take the survey, or apply to serve on the Alpine Park playground committee!

The City Council has authorized capital improvement funds to prepare plans to replace the aging Alpine Park playground equipment (pictured above) and provide ADA improvements. The plan will allow the City to formulate a construction budget in the event additional capital improvement funds or grants become available in the future.

The Parks & Recreation Department is seeking up to three neighborhood representatives to join the committee that will develop the Alpine Park playground renovation plan and consider playground equipment options. Committee members will be asked to attend several meetings via Zoom and a final presentation at a Parks & Recreation Commission meeting. This process is expected to take several months. Please note: this committee is for adults only; no children will be included in the meetings.

**HOW OFTEN DO YOU SERVE:** The City Council can appoint you to either a two-year or four-year term. The regular Board meetings are held on the second Wednesday of each month, beginning at 6:00 p.m.

## Big Turnout for Burlingame Drill

A total of 321 Burlingame residents representing 24 neighborhood groups participated in the ninth annual [Burlingame Disaster Survival Drill](#) hosted by the Burlingame Neighborhood Network (BNN) on Saturday, October 9, along with Burlingame police officers, Central County firefighters, and Ham radio operators.

The drill returned to an in-person format with neighbors observing County health protocols as they patrolled local streets looking for “incidents” and describing emergency situations such as downed power lines and collapsed houses. In 2020, the drill was conducted via Zoom.

Suzanne Tateosian of BNN’s board said a total of 31 neighborhoods groups have received [free caches of emergency supplies](#). The caches, which are valued at \$550, are awarded to neighborhood groups that participate in at least two annual drills and host other neighborhood activities. They are funded by the City of Burlingame.

Burlingame City Manager Lisa Goldman signed up for a **free solar SunShares audit** last year and followed up by purchasing a home solar energy system through the program. Lisa shared that, “getting solar was much easier than I thought, especially knowing that I was signing up with an already vetted contractor.” Lisa has been enjoying tracking her solar energy production on a mobile app. This year, SunShares expanded their program to offer discounts for solar combined with battery storage.

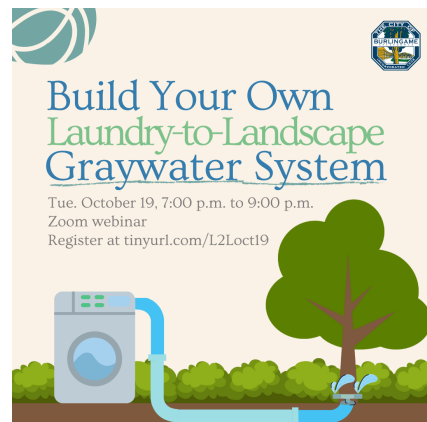

Learn how to build a "laundry-to-landscape" graywater system for directing water from your clothes washer to the garden for irrigation. Laundry-to-landscape systems can save thousands of gallons of precious drinking water per year. Plus, it does not require a building permit!

## Get the MyShake App to Receive Earthquake Warnings

The annual [Great California ShakeOut](#) will take place on **Thursday, October 21**. This is an opportunity for individuals, families, schools, and businesses to practice simple, but critical safety steps that can keep them safe during an earthquake, such as "drop, cover, and hold on".

[Cal OES, the Governor's Office of Emergency Services](#), is urging Californians to join in the Great California ShakeOut and download the free MyShake App to receive earthquake warnings. The MyShake App is **available for free** from the [Apple App](#) and [Google Play](#) stores. To receive earthquake warnings, individuals and family members can download the app and make sure settings are adjusted to receive emergency alerts, including turning location settings to "always on" so that the app technology can connect with nearby ground sensors in the event of shaking.

The free MyShake App provides earthquake warnings for California.
