Burlingame's 9th Annual Disaster Drill

Burlingame residents are invited to sign up for the 9th annual Disaster Survival Drill, which will take place from **9:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, October 9**. To sign up, send an email to info@burlingamenetwork.org with your name and street address and indicate whether you want to lead a block or join another group. You will be contacted by a BNN representative. Signups will be taken as long as possible. There is no charge, and all supplies will be provided.

No experience is necessary to participate. Neighborhood leads and anyone interested are invited to two free training sessions on Zoom. A **Drill Walk-Through Training** will take place tonight from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. [Register by clicking here](#). A **Communications Workshop** will be held on Wednesday, September 29, from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. [Click here to register](#).

Hosted by the Burlingame Neighborhood Network (BNN), the drill is supported by the Central County Fire Department, the Burlingame Police Department, [Burlingame Community Emergency Response Team \(CERT\)](#) members, and local HAM radio operators. It will be an in-person, outdoor drill that observes County health protocols. Participants will practice how to organize in teams to help one another after a simulated earthquake and how to report major incidents to a simulated Emergency Operations Center.

Thanks to support from the City of Burlingame, neighborhood groups in the city that participate in at least two drills and have other occasional activities may qualify for a [free emergency cache](#) valued at \$700. Blocks with caches that participate in this year's drill will receive a **DeWalt two-way, two-watt FRS radio** to enable better communication. All blocks will receive drill kits (or refresher materials).

SamTrans Needs Volunteers for the Measure W Citizens' Oversight Committee

SamTrans is recruiting members for the Measure W Congestion Relief Plan Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee (COC). The COC is tasked with reviewing the administration of tax revenue to ensure that funds are invested in a manner consistent with the Plan.

Appointed members of the COC will receive findings of an independent audit, hold a public hearing, and issue a report annually to provide county residents with information regarding how [Measure W](#) revenues are being spent. SamTrans is accepting applications to fill the following five seats:

1. Youth Transit Rider Representative to represent riders under the age of 25
2. Organized Labor Representative to represent working people in San Mateo County
3. Private Sector Employer Representative to represent employers in San Mateo County
4. County Supervisor District 1 Representative to represent Supervisorial District 1 (Burlingame, Hillsborough, Millbrae, San Bruno)
5. County Supervisor District 2 Representative to represent Supervisorial District 2 (San Mateo, Foster City, Belmont)

The new COC members will be appointed by the SamTrans Board of Directors based upon a written application, although interviews may also be requested.
