Storm Drain Measure Oversight Committee Vacancy


The City of Burlingame is currently accepting applications for a vacancy on the Storm Drain Measure Oversight Committee.

In May 2009, voters approved a ballot measure to collect storm drain fees in order to upgrade the storm drainage system, alleviate chronic flooding, and protect public health and safety. The ballot measure required the creation of a citizens' oversight committee, to ensure funds collected from the storm drain fees are spent only on the storm drainage program.

The Storm Drain Measure Oversight Committee consists of three members and generally meets once a year. 
