City Council Selects Draft Map D for District Elections

At its December 6, 2021 meeting, the City Council selected Draft Map D for the City's future district elections. Redistricting Partners, the City's consultants, drew this map after reviewing community input at the November 1st hearing on the initial three draft maps.

The City Council will formally adopt Map D at their January 3, 2022 meeting via an ordinance that also transitions the City to district elections and sets the order for which districts will be on the ballot in 2022, and which will be on the ballot in 2024. Map D has been updated on the City's website from its previous form to show that it is final and to show the proposed numbering of the districts. Previously, the districts were titled A through E. However, under the proposed ordinance adopting Map D, the districts have been titled 1 through 5.

The City's next election is scheduled for November 2022. Since Mayor Ortiz, Vice Mayor Brownrigg, and Councilmember O'Brien Keighran are all up for election in 2022, staff is recommending that the Council put the two districts that these three Councilmembers live in (Districts 1 and 3) on the ballot in 2022. Additionally, staff is proposing putting District 5 on the November 2022 ballot. District 5 encompasses Lyon Hoag, Burlingables, and Burlingame Gardens. To run for one of these three Council seats on the November 2022 ballot, you will need to live in the district that is up for election: Districts 1, 3, and 5.

Staff is further recommending that the Council place Districts 2 and 4, where Councilmember Beach and Councilmember Colson live, on the ballot in November 2024 as that election lines up with the end of their at-large terms.

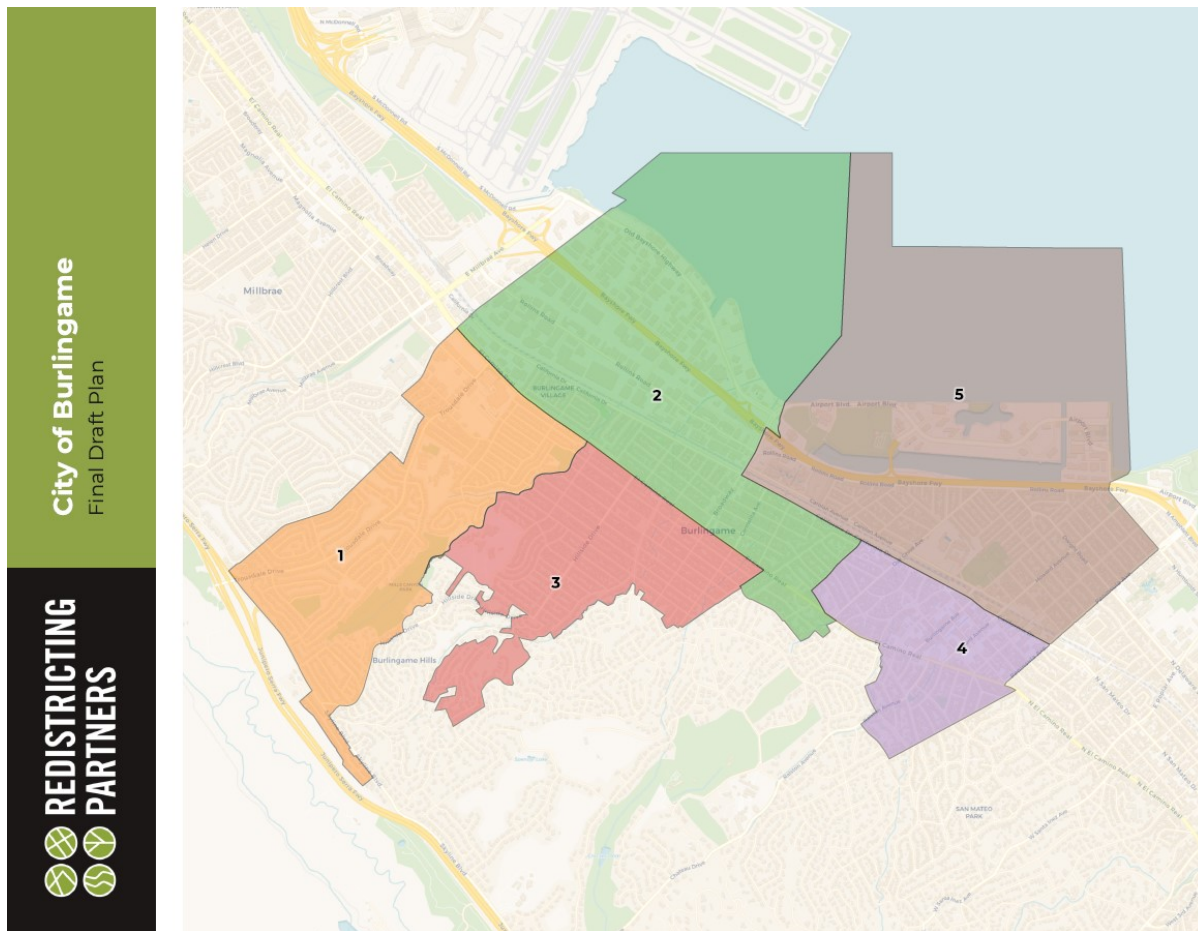

Compost Your Christmas Tree

Recology San Mateo County collects holiday trees curbside for composting between January 3rd and January 31st, on your regular collection day. Please remove all decorations and tree stands (flocked trees are accepted) before placing next to your green compost cart or inside your cart, trunk sticking out. Trees may be up to 8 feet in length. If your tree is longer than 8 feet, please cut the tree before placing the pieces next to or in your compost cart. After January 31st, please cut the tree to fit inside the compost cart.

Residential Survey

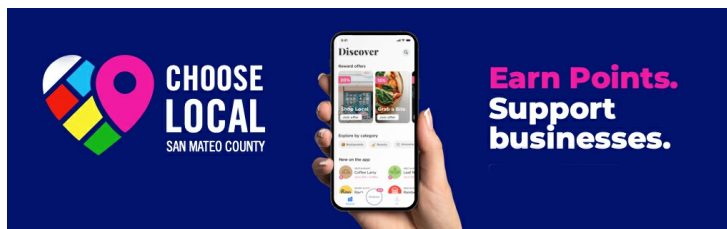

The purpose of the Count is to gather information to help us understand who is experiencing homelessness in our community and what interventions they need to end their homelessness.
