November 8, 2022 is the City's First District Election

The City Clerk's Office has recently heard from many citizens concerning the City's transition to district elections. Individuals have asked who has pulled papers, when does candidate filing close, and when will the election be held.

Here is some information to clear up questions that you may have.

When will the City hold district elections?

The City's first district election will take place on November 8, 2022 for Districts 1, 3, and 5. To review the five districts, go to:

Do you have to live in the district to run for that Council seat?

Yes, you must live in the district to run for that Council seat. This is verified based on your voter registration.

Do you have to live in the district to vote for that Council seat?

Yes. Beginning with the November 2022 election, registered voters will only vote for the Council seat that is in their district. Therefore, if you live in Districts 2 or 4, you won't vote for a Councilmember until November 2024.

When does candidate filing open for the three Council seats on the November 2022 ballot?

Candidate filing (when an individual interested in running for Council pulls their nomination papers and files their Declaration of Candidacy) will open for these three seats in mid-July. All necessary paperwork must be filed with the City Clerk's Office by mid-August. However, some interested candidates may want to start raising money for their race. This is separate from the candidate filing period and is done by opening a campaign committee with the <u>Fair Political Practices Commission</u>.







The San Mateo Union High School District is Transitioning to By-Trustee Area Elections

Like so many public agencies in the Bay Area and State of California, the San Mateo Union High School District is transitioning to by-trustee area elections. This will:

- Prevent an at-large election system from diluting minority voting power, and protect the ability of minorities to influence the outcome of an election.
- Create maps to balance the population of the District into five voting areas while enhancing minority voting rights.
- Allow voters to elect a single Board member from the trustee area they live in, which can lower the costs of candidates running for School Board.
